Washington, 4. februarja. Razmerje med American Federation of Labor in med Committee for Industrial Organization je postalo še bolj napeto, ko je predsednik William Green od American Federation of Labor zavrnil ponovne mirovne ponudbe.

Obenem je označil John Lewis kot glavnega povzročitelja vseh delavskih sporov in spopadov in kot osebo, ki je razdvojila ameriške delavske vrste, ki so danes predmet izkoristitve od strani velekapitala. Ob istem času je pa Charles Howard, predsednik unije tiskarjev in tajnik C. I. O. unije, osebno napadel Greena, ker ni prišel na osebni sestanek svoje unije, da razloži svoje postopanje.

Detroit, 4. februarja. Packard Motor Car Co. je danes naznaila, da je znižala cene vsem modelom svojih avtomobilov za \$100,00. Kot se je izjavil predsednik družbe, je kompanija odredila ta korak, da bi prodala več avtomobilov in tako pospešila obrat v svojih tovarnah. Znižanje cen ne pomeni, da se kompanija namerava iznebiti starih modelov, pač pa je znižanje na novih modelih, katerih je približno malo v zalogi. Kompanija pričakuje radi znižanja cen mnogo novih naročil.

Ubila roparja sta Vincent Grinkowicz, o katerem se je najprvo mislilo, da je prosluli ropar Charles Bird, in neki drugi ropar, ki je znan pod imenom "Mac". Ranjeni ropar je Chas. Boettcher, eden izmed onih štirih roparjev, ki so lansko leto oropali Lorain St. banko v Clevelandu in odnesli \$17.000. Prijeti ropar je označil svoje ime kot Steve Figuli.

Nadaljni angleški parnik je bil potopljen

Barcelona, 4. februarja. Drugi angleški tovorni parnik tekom enega tedna je bil danes potopljen v bližini španske obale. Baje so ga potopile bombe, katere so izstrelili zrakoplovci generala Franca. Španska vlada uradno naznanja, da sta dva nacionalistična zrakoplova dospela iz otoka Majorca in se lotila angleškega parnika. Moštvo na parniku je bilo rešeno.

Mestni uslužbenci

Mestni councilman Charles Vanik je včeraj vložil tožbo proti mestnemu finančnemu direktorju, da slednjemu prepriča za zanašljive plačevati one mestne uslužbence, ki stanujejo izven mesta. Najmanj 600 mestnih uslužbencev ne prebiva v Clevelandu, pač pa v okolici ali v predmestjih. Councilman Vanik trdi, da je protipostavno, da dotični uslužbenci dobivajo plačo od mesta, toda davke plačujejo drugje. To je v škodo Clevelanda. Sicer pa že sam čarter govori, da morajo biti vsi mestni uslužbenci prebivalci mesta Clevelanda.

Premalo relifa

Državni avditor Ferguson se je izjavil včeraj, da vsota \$12.000.000, ki je bila določena od državne postavodaje za relif v letu 1938, niti do 1. julija. V očigled položaja, kot prevladuje sedaj, ko se radi privatnega pomankanja dela prigljuje vedno več ljudi za relif, bo potrebno nadaljnjih \$12.000.000 v letu 1938, da se vsaj deloma postreže vsem onim, ki so v resnici potrebni in upravičeni do relifne podpore od države.

Gostilniške licence

Državna komisija za kontrolo opojne pijače je preklicala tri permite gostilničarjev v Clevelandu in suspendirala nadaljne štiri.

Župan v Chicagu

Župan Harold Burton se je včeraj v spremstvu drugih mestnih uradnikov podal v Chicagu, kjer se bo posvetoval glede WPA projektov v Clevelandu.

Nenavadna zima

Washington, 4. februarja. J. B. Kincer, ki je vrhovni načelnik vladnega vremenskega urada, se strinja z mišljenjem milijonov ostalih Amerikancev, ki trdijo, da je letošnja zima "nekaž nenavadna." "Nekateri ljudje," je rekel Mr. Kincer, "trdijo, da je vreme odvisno od raznih peg na soncu, toda meni nikakor ne gre v glavo, kako bi te pege mogle vplivati na vreme na zemlji." Vzhodno od Mississippija letos ni skoro nobenega dežja ali druge padavine, dočim imajo v osrednje-zapadnih državah štirikrat toliko moče kot v normalnih zimah. V severozapadnih državah je zapadlo dvakrat toliko snega kot običajno. Povsod pa trdijo ljudje, da je vreme letos bolj spremenljivo kot sicer, in sicer sledijo spremembe ena drugi tako hitro, da najde ljudi popolnoma nepraviljene.

Odmevi preiskave o političnem graftu

Columbus, O., 4. februarja. V petek je bilo jako živahno tekom zaslišanja, ki ga vodi posebni senatni odsek napram raznim državnim uradnikom, katerim se očita, da so sleparili vlado. Na zaslišanju je bil včeraj Glenn Horn, ki kupuje za državo Ohio razne potrebščine. Med drugim se Hornu očita, da je od prijateljskih kompanij kupal premož za državo Ohio in plačeval za premož po \$1.68 tona, dočim bi ga lahko kupil po 90c tona. Očividno je nekdo tu služil ogromne vsote denarja. Načelnik senatnega preiskovalnega odseka je vprašal Horna, zakaj ni dobavljal premož za državo z razpisom ponudb. Hornov odvetnik je pa svetoval Hornu, da ni treba odgovoriti na to vprašanje, naker je ukazal načelnik preiskovalnega odseka vreči odvetnika iz zbornice, obenem je pa odredil aretacijo Horna, ki se bo mora zagovarjati v torek popoldne.

Mesto zgubilo tožbo

Mesto Cleveland je zgubilo prvo tožbo, katero je naperilo proti zvezni premogovni komisiji radi cen premoga. Zvezni sodnik Ruhleng je vrgel tožbo iz sodnije, rekoč, da on nima pravice o tem obravnavati, pač pa se mora mestna vlada obrniti na drugo sodnijo. To bi moral clevelandski mestni direktorji postav že prej vedeti, da ne bi ustrelili takega kozla. Mesto trdi, da je radi odločbe vladne komisije prisiljeno plačevati na leto \$300.000 več za premož kot lansko leto.

106.000 oseb se smrtno ponesrečilo v letu 1937

Chicago, 4. februarja. Razne nesreče so lansko leto v Zedinjenih državah zahtevale silne žrtve. Nič manj kot 106.000 oseb je bilo ubitih ali je sicer v tej ali oni nesreči našlo svojo smrt. Poleg tega pa je dobilo 375.000 oseb poškodbe, da so hrome in nesposobne za delo za vse življenje, dočim je dobilo lažje poškodbe skoro deset milijonov oseb, natančno 9.400.000. Te številke je priobčil tudi v javnosti National Safety Council, ki vodi vse leto statistiko tozadevno. In te žrtve so zahvale tudi ogromne vsote denarja, kar se tiče brezdelice, ko niso ponesrečene osebe imele zaslužka tekom nesreče ali bolezni. Ta vsota se računa na \$3.700.000.000. Od te vsote odpade \$2.250.000.000 za razne bolnišnice, zdravnike, zdravila, bolniške strožnice in enako. K tej vsoti se pa mora prišteti še \$870.000.000, ki predstavlja škodo narejeno na poslopljih in hišah, na razbitih avtomobilih in enako. Poleg avtomobilskih nesreč je največ ljudi umrlo, ker so padli. 28.000 ljudi je bilo na ta način ubitih. Zgorelo je v ognju 8.000 oseb, utonilo jih je nad 7.000, v železniških nesrečah je našlo smrt 3.000 ljudi, ustreljenih je bilo 4.000, 3.000 oseb se je zadušilo s plinom, in 2.000 oseb je bilo zastrupljenih. Iz raznih drugih vzrokov je storilo nesrečno smrt nadaljnjih 15.000 ljudi.

Igralni stroji

Policija v Clevelandu je tekom letošnjega leta zaplenila nekaj nad 200 igralnih strojev, katere je dobila v raznih trgovskih prostorih. V zaplenjenih strojih je dobila policija \$1.023 v centih, in kljih, desetih in kvodrih. Ta denar je bil izročen pokojninskemu fondu za policiste in ognjegazet.

Cene zopet padle

Cene delnic na borzi, ki so se začetkom tega tedna precej dvignile, so proti koncu tedna zopet padle, tako da so najnižje tekom zadnjih treh let.

Moški in ženske

New York, 4. februarja. Dr. William H. Carey, slavni ginecolog v newyorški Livingston bolnišnici, je včeraj izjavil, da postajajo moški od leta do leta bolj čednostni kot ženske. Tekom zadnjih deset let je dr. Carey opazoval moralno obnašanje žensk in moških in prišel do zaključka, da so moški danes mnogo bolj moralni kot ženske in da pri ženskah morala naravnost propada. Dr. Carey pripisuje žensko razuzdanost večji svobodi in neodvisnosti, katero ženske, zlasti mlada dekleta zadnje čase uživajo. Planile so brez pomisleka v nove razmere. Nadalje pravi dr. Carey, da ima alkohol velik vpliv pri tem. Mlada dekleta danes mnogo pijejo, moški so bili že prej vajeni pijače. Ometena po alkoholu, dekleta ne pazijo dovolj na svojo moralo in čistost.

Japonci so doživeli nove zmage na Kitajskem

Šangaj, 4. februarja. Japonske armade so se ponovno pomaknile bližje centrali kitajskega železniškega omrežja. Japonsko vrhovno poveljstvo je izdalo povelje načelnikom tujzemskih misijonkih postaj v okolišu Tientsin-Pukov železniškega okraja, da se umaknejo. V tem kraju je 22 ameriških misijonkih postaj. Japonci nameravajo omenjeno pokrajino zasedati. Včeraj so Japonci napredovali za 19 milj južno od Sučova in se približujejo središču kitajskih železnic. Japoncem nasproti stoji 400.000 možna kitajska armada, ki je razstavljena na 180 milj dolgi fronti. Ta armada je dosedaj zabranjevala Japoncem, da niso mogli združiti svojih severnih armad z armado ob Jangtseki. V Pengpu okraju so Japonci doživeli nove zmage, čemur pa Kitajci oporekajo, ki pa obenem priznavajo svoje lastne težke zgube na bojišču.

Organizacija gostilničarjev

V bližnjem mestu Euclidu se nahaja 20 gostilen. Te dni je imelo 12 gostilničarjev sejo, da se organizirajo proti brutalnemu nastopanju direktorja javne varnosti McMasteru. Gostilničarji trdijo, da odkar je postal McMaster direktor, da je začela policija neopravičeno in brutalno nastopati proti njim. Zato bodo ustvarili organizacijo, ki naj se bori za njih interese. McMaster zahteva od gostilničarjev, da morajo svoje goste pognati iz gostilen natančno ob 1. uri zjutraj, četudi imajo slednji pred seboj še kozarce pive ali druge pijače ali prigrizek. Postava se mora strogo spoštovati, je dejal McMaster.

Načelnik unije avtomobilskih delavcev Homer Martin dolži rdečkarje, da povzročujejo štrajke in nemire pri unijah

New York, 4. februarja. Homer Martin, predsednik United Automobile Workers of America, je izjavil v petek, da se mora iz unijskih vrst izločiti ves komunistični vpliv in aktivnosti, ako hočejo ameriške unije napredovati.

Homer Martin se je direktno izjavil, da komunisti v delavskih vrstah neprestano hujskajo delavce, da povzročajo nepostavne štrajke in s tem povzročajo, da je industrija nestalna in zasluček negotov. To je pa voda na mlin rdečkarjev.

Nadalje je Homer Martin obdolžil komuniste, da na nepostaven način izrabljajo unijski denar za komunistično organizacijo in delajo propagando, katere namen je pahnti Ameriko v vojno z Japonsko v korist Rusije.

Unija avtomobilskih delavcev je druga največja organizacija pri C. I. O. Ta unija šteje do malega 400.000 članov. Komunisti v tej uniji so primeroma maloštevilni, toda znali so se poriniti v sprednje vrste in zavajati delavce.

Homer Martin je včeraj tudi izjavil, da je prva in največja potreba izločiti vse komuniste iz vrst organiziranega delavstva. Izločitev komunistov bo prva naloga druge konvencije avtomobilskih delavcev, ki se vrši v letu 1939.

"V Ameriki se vse preveč piše o nacizmu in fašizmu," je dejal Martin. "Toda kdor začne govoriti o stalinizmu ali komunizmu, takoj padejo po njem, češ, da pobija rdečkarje. Naša naloga je izključiti politiko iz delavskih vrst."

Italijansko časopisje vedno bolj besno napada Zedinjene države in predsednika

Rim, 4. februarja. Italijansko časopisje je postalo zadnje čase tako surovo z napadi na predsednika Roosevelta, da je dobil ameriški poslanik v Rimu povelje, da se zgleda v uradu laškega ministra za zunanje zadeve in pronajde vzrok napadom.

Obenem z napadi na predsednika Roosevelta je začelo laško časopisje zlasti osorno napadati ameriške žide in njih propagando.

Ameriški poslanik Phillips bo obiskal te dni enkrat laškega zunanjega ministra grofa Cia-

no, ki je zet diktatorja Mussolinija. Predpriprave za konferenco so sedaj v teku.

Dasi ima ameriški poslanik povelje, da ne vložil uradnega protesta pri laški vladi glede napadov časopisja na predsednika Roosevelta, pa bo dobila ameriška vlada gotova pojasnila, ki naj pokažejo vzroke, zakaj fašizem vedno bolj sovraži demokratično Ameriko.

Po mnenju ameriških državnikov nima Italija niti najmanjšega povoda napadati Ameriko, od katere ima Italija mnogobrojne koristi.

Z današnjim dnevom priobčuje North American Mortgage Loan Co. finančni račun svojega stanja, vzet iz poročila priznanih pregledovalcev knjig, Laubscher & Smith. Ta račun je priobčen v angleščini, ker je istega skoro nemogoče prestaviti v slovenščino, da bi bila prestava dovoljna zgorej omenjeni firmi pregledovalcev knjig.

Da vlagatelji ves položaj boljše razumejo, da istega lažje primerjajo z drugimi finančnimi zavodi, bo potrebno, da posežemo nazaj nekaj let in sodimo nepristransko.

Slovenska North American banka je bila ustanovljena leta 1920. Napredovala je hitro.

Prišla pa je v deželo depresija. Leta 1930 je imela slovenska banka nad pet milijonov dolarjev vlog. V sled brezposelnosti in deloma vsled splošnega strahu in nezaupljivosti, je banka do marca 1933 izplačala svojim vlagateljem nad dva milijona in pol dolarjev.

Meseca marca 1933 je bila banka postavljena pod konservatorja.

Na 1. oktobra 1934 je bila banka reorganizirana in je izplačala vlagateljem okoli pol milijona dolarjev. Slovenska banka je nadaljevala z novim kapitalom \$125,000.00, ostalo premoženje je bilo pa dejano v novo North American Mortgage Loan Co., da to premoženje ohrani in ž njim gospodari tako, da bo končno izplačala vlagateljem do celoti.

Samo še dve drugi banki v Clevelandu sta dobili tako pravico, to je Bank of Cleveland in Lorain Street Bank. Razumeti se mora, da kjer je vlada prišla do prepričanja, da je položaj brezupen, tedaj je bila banka prisiljena v likvidacijo, kot na primer Union Trust Co. in Guardian Trust Co. in prej še Standard Trust Co.

"Mortgage" kompanije, ki so prevzele takozvane "zamrznjene" vloge teh treh bank (Bank of Cleveland, Lorain Street Bank in North American Trust Co.), imajo torej nalogo, da ohranijo, gospodarijo, počasno likvidirajo svoje premoženje. Dozdaj še nobena teh družb ni plačala kake dividende, razen North American Mortgage Loan Co.

Meseca oktobra 1934 je North American Mortgage Loan Co. prevzela iz reorganizacije okrog cnega milijona tri sto tisoč dolarjev dolga. V treh letih (do 1. oktobra 1937) je odplačala tega dolga nad en milijon dolarjev. Vse to je bilo doseženo s prodajo raznih obveznic, bondov, iztirjatvijo dolgovi in prodajo posestev:

Odbor je takoj v začetku sklenil, da najprej odplača ves dolg in šele potem začne plačevati dividende. To edino iz vzroka, da se prihrani obresti na dolg. Ker se je pa kriza zopet postrčila, je bilo sklenjeno, da se plača dividendo pet procentov sedaj in si je v ta namen izposodil dodatnega posojila \$65,000.00. Tako znaša zdaj celoten dolg pri Central National banki \$354,000, na

katerega plačujemo po 2 1/2% obresti.

Marsikdo je že povpraševal: koliko so sedaj vredne knjžice North American Mortgage Loan Co.? Do centa je to nemogoče odgovoriti, ker se tržne cene naših obveznic spreminjajo vsak dan. Ernest Jerman: MY EXPERIENCES IN SPAIN

(A Translation from the Slovene)

(Continuation.)

This old woman, too, was the victim of young militia at whose head was some forty year old "woman." Imagine! She was a member, a regular member of the "death squad" on the revolutionary board. She acted only at such times as required the removal of the "better people"; for the "lower elements" were left to the bloodthirstiness of other fiendish women and chits. In the militia, those of the rank of sergeant rode around in a luxurious "Hudson" automobile. What tailor Nieto is among men, Fernanda is among the red women.

The motive for murdering the old woman is not quite clear even today. But at least in Albacete there is no need for motives to kill people. However, it seems that someone wanted to inherit the old woman's possessions which were deposited in a bank.

Outside of Albacete, too, acts of terrorism occurred. I was not acquainted with the murdered persons although the whole town talked about the murders. Towards the end of November, for instance, thirty-two men were taken in Hellin, who had been rounded up one morning in the villages, and then sent to Albacete. Here they were held for eight days while awaiting their trial which lasted exactly forty-five minutes and resulted in a verdict of death. Because relatives wired and telephoned Madrid headquarters asking for pardon, five were freed but the remaining twenty-seven men were shot with machine guns.

Albacete and its surrounding territory distinguished itself next to Barcelona and Malaga for manslaughter.

As I approach the close of my article I utter hope that what the Spanish nation has undergone will serve as a warning to Europe and all her nations which still pretend to some civilization to rise up with all their might against Marxian propaganda. This ideal which is spreading in the form of murder and robbery is evil in itself. Let the slogan: LIBERTY, EQUALITY, and FRA-

TERNITY never be stained with the blood of innocent people. This is the slogan of a sound civilization although bolshevism barbarism can never boast of it as has been demonstrated in Spain.

Today Albacete is the headquarters for the Soviet general staff and mobilization center for the so-called international brigade, that is, an armada of foreign volunteers who came to the aid of the bolshevist government in Spain. Albacete is ideally situated for this purpose. It is about three hundred miles distant from the Basque front, about one hundred forty miles from Madrid, and eighty miles from Valencia, seat of the red government. Alicante, too, which is a large shipping center can be reached in a short time by train or the fine concrete highway.

A month after the red seizure the Madrid government sent former president of the ministry, Martinez Barrios, to Albacete instructing him to prepare with governor de Vego, all arrangements to make Albacete the central point for mobilizing volunteers. This was the little town which (we could say) never had seen foreigners; which was visited only rarely by tourists and lovers of the memories of Don Quixote's homeland, in the Province of "LaManche" of which Albacete is the capital.

The first foreigners who marched into Albacete were Germans. They, of course, aroused a great deal of attention, for their number was large, marching fully two hours through town into the stadium used for bull-fighting and into a monastery which stood opposite the main entrance of the arena. Here they were quartered. The greater part of them were anti-Hitlerites who had escaped from Germany and were seeking employment in the civil war. For the red government had been promising enticing pays, room and board plus fifty pesos a week. A field kitchen was organized in the stadium arena.

The revolutionary committee also appointed me an interpreter and gave me permission to have the Germans gather in my cafe because I spoke their language. Thus I came in touch with them and at times found out really strange reasons that had sent these people to Spain and right into the ranks of red armada. There was not even a trace of some kind of enthusiasm for the bolshevist ideals or some idea of opposition to the so-called fascism. I will not say that a few idealists were not among those whom the fight for an ideal had brought to Spain; but it was this very group which was disillusioned first when it saw how the land of its dreams looked and what the "struggle for proletarian ideals" really was; especially after the men came in contact with the red militiamen.

Others came to earn some money and, of course, soon had their eyes opened when they received a mere five pesos instead of fifty! When they began to grumble the commander soon despatched them to the fiercest front, the one located before Cordova, from where they most likely never returned alive. At least we never saw them again in Albacete.

Before long into Albacete with a large staff of officers and agitators. In command was General Kleber who, however, remained in Madrid. The officers were first sent to Madriaga and were ordered to fortify the town, although the Soviet detachment remained in our city.

New arrivals were coming constantly departing into the interior, returning again, and so on. The Russians generally spoke Spanish fluently and even wore the uniforms of the red Spanish officers.

In a couple of weeks the Russian officers became masters of the city. They confiscated the bedding; every family had to supply one bed. With this a hospital was organized. If the people did not give in peacefully, force was used and without apologies.

A second group organized military training of the volunteers. For this purpose the city park was appropriated where drilling took place from five in the morning to five in the evening. Drilling lasted three days whereupon the recruits were sent to the front. Room and board, five pesos a week, plus tobacco was all they got. No one was allowed to desert. If one was apprehended in flight he was placed against a wall and shot before the eyes of the rest.

As the first corps left for the front there was a shedding of tears and it was a sad sight to see these weepers, boys cast together from the four winds, departing to the death front of Cordova. They were without soldiers' caps, clothed only in bed-covers; without proper shoes, wearing only Spanish "alpargatos," sandals made from sheep's skin. I am convinced that none of them is alive today.

Then whole droves of volunteers began to pour in, mostly Italians, Magyar, and French. They were arriving chiefly from French camps. There were few Russians; but then the more officers and leaders were supplied from Russia. And what about Jugoslavs? I suppose you ask.

In the early part of November, 1936 the Jugoslavs arrived. There were one hundred fifty and came from French camps. By the middle of November the second group numbering about two hundred fifty men came. They were brought on French transport ships. Some of them came mixed with Italians and Frenchmen. Most of these boys and men were from Croatia, particularly from Dalmatia.

There were some Slovenes among them, too. We counted these immediately and I doubt that any escaped me. They may have but I do not believe so because we watched the transports closely. In all I counted twenty-seven Slovenes. You can imagine how happy I was when after twenty years I once again heard Slovenian and Slovenian songs. (To be Continued)
