kazala dosedanja preiskava

Scalise požrl poldrugi milijon
dolarjev
Preiskava knjig je dokazala,
da je dobila unija od svojih čla-
nov in članic — žensk, ki ribajo in
čistijo pisarniška poslopja, od
čistilcev oken, od janitorjev in
od operatorjev dvigal, torej od
samih deincev — \$1,800,000 na
unijskih prispevkih tekem treh
let, v blagajni pa so našle obla-
sti samo \$92,000.

Med nakazanimi stroški je bi-
la navedena vsota \$122,400 za
vzdrževanje urada glavnega sta-
na v Chicagu, za vzdrževanje
newyorškega urada, kjer je imel
Scalise svoj glavni stan, in de-
nar, ki je šel kot prispevek za
Ameriško delavsko federacijo.

Kakor indijski maharadža

sejan, kakor se je Scalisi zdelo
in poljubilo. V teh izdatkih je
dalje vključena Scaliseva plača

je vojni urad naznanil, in sicer
že drugi v dveh dneh, nov umik
angleških čet iz Norveške.

Clement Davies, kraljev sve-
tovalec, je zahteval snoči v jav-
nem govoru v Oxfordu, da mora
Chamberlain iti. "Kar mi zahte-
vamo in hočemo, je resnični vojni
kabinet, kateremu bo načelo-
val mož, ki bo vedel, kaj hoče in

nja," je dejal govornik.

PARIZ, 2. maja. — Leon
Blum, bivši socialistični premier
francoske vlade, pravi v listu
"Populaire," da bo Mussolini e-
dini človek v Italiji, ki bo odločil,
da-li vstopi Italija v vojno ali o-
stane izven nje.

"Govori in piše se," pravi
Blum, "da se vse visoke itali-
janske duhovne in materialne
sile — papež, prestolonaslednik,
generalni štab, finančniki in in-
dustrijski — nagibajo na stran
zaveznikov ter da so nasprotni
nameri, da bi šla Italija ob stra-
ni Hitlerja v vojno. Pravijo tudi,
da je celo več visokih fašističnih
voditeljev tega naziranja."

"Jaz nikakor ne trdim, da v
Italiji ni drugačnega naziranja
in mnenja kot je mnenje Mus-
solinija, saj so v sami fašistični
stranki ljudje, ki mislijo drugače
kakor duče. Toda kljub temu je
dejstvo, da odločuje danes v I-
taliji samo Mussolinijeva beseda."

"Zato bo samo Mussolinijev
odlok potegnil Italijo v vojno, ali
pa jo obdržal izven nje. Zato so
odnosaji Italije napram Franci-
ji takšni, kakršne želi Mussoli-
ni."

Bond Issue Will Create Jobs

Jobs for thousands of men will be one of the direct results of voting up the \$4,500,000 County Bond Issue on May 14. These jobs will not mean any increase in taxes.

State and Federal highway funds of \$10,000,000 from gas tax money will furnish the funds for construction of six super highways. The County Bonds will furnish money to buy rights-of-way so that the highways can be built.

The gas tax money is available to build the highways as soon as voters approve the County Highway Bonds. The bonds will not raise County

taxes because more than the \$4,500,000 worth of existing County Bonds will be retired before it becomes necessary to begin payments on the Highway Bonds.

According to County Engineer John O. McWilliams, the building of these six highways will shorten driving time and public transportation schedules throughout the county, because thousands of automobiles now crowded on main streets will go to the new highways as soon as they are built. Streets cars and busses then will be able to make much better time. — County Highway Council.

Religion was on the decline. Churches, parishes and chapels were either in ruin or empty; the people sank into superstition and immortality; the schools forgotten; among the clergy ignorance, rebellion and licentiousness became prevalent, and among the exploited masses spread various bubonic diseases and a despairing discontent.

Many of the nobles and village boys from the Slovenian provinces sought their education in German and Swiss, Lutheran, Calvinist or Zwinglist towns and returned home with ideas and books which found sympathizers and enthusiasts among the Slovenes. Lutheranism spread into towns and villages; the anabaptists appeared and thus arose great religious confusion which further increased the number of the so-called "flagellants," "stigmatisms," "ecstasies" and "jumpers."

Primož Trubar, who was born in Rašica pri Turjaku, Lower Carniola, on June 8, 1508, was educated in the court of the bishop of Trieste, Peter Bonomo, who was a humanist and liberal educator. Here Trubar occupied himself with the Roman poets, particularly with the writings of Erasmus of Rotterdam and the French religious reformer Calvin, that is, with the works of men who were demanding certain reforms in the Church. Thus already as a youth Trubar became filled with the Protestant spirit.

In 1530 when Trubar became pastor in Laški Trg and at the same time also vicar in Loga pri Radečah he ran into his first trouble with a Slovene woman. This woman was telling the peo-

The great storms which began to rage in the spiritual life of Europe at the beginning of the 16th century and precipitated the violent struggle between the Catholic Church and the universal demand for necessary, basic church reforms also began to penetrate the thinking and problems of the Slovenian people. Indeed, this struggle penetrated so deep into conditions in the Slovene lands that with the Reformation a new period began in the history of the Slovenes.

In the Catholic Church resigned luxurious ostentation on the one hand and extreme poverty on the other. The upper clergy became political functionaries and fought for political power and a place in the court of the rules; most of the upper clergy enjoyed income from several parishes, but their services were performed by the many lower clergy for a nominal compensation.

ple of her village that SS. Sebastian and Roque had appeared before her and commanded her to erect a new church in their honor in Kompolje or they would bring death and pestilence on the people and animals of the village. As it happened, a terrible plague did come over Styria in 1529, and she thus found many followers. A wooden chapel was immediately erected. Priests said Mass in it, and the people began to collect money for a new church.

Trubar took a firm stand against this woman and many people took sides with him, but most of the pastors were so violently opposed to him that he was forced to leave his parish. Thus a woman won over Trubar!

"The seeds for the new religious ideas," writes Dr. Josip Gruden in his "Zgodovina slovenskega naroda," "for a certainty already began to blossom into action here because the people later on burned the church of St. Sebastian in Loka." It was only in 1576 that the people did finally build a new church near the monastery of St. George in Poljane ob Radežu.

His second conflict because of a woman was experienced by Trubar in Ljubljana in 1542 when he opposed the views of the anabaptists, stigmatists, etc. He particularly condemned the pilgrims. The occasion for his bitter attacks was the pilgrimages to Sveta Gora in Gorica, which began about this time.

Urška Ferligojnica, a shepherdess, began the rumor that in 1539 she had visions of the Mother of God on the mountain of Skalnica nad Solkanom. People believed the shepherdess and built a chapel where for centuries another church had stood. Then began a collection of money for a great new church which was really built and consecrated in 1544. Soon after Sveta Gora became a favorite pilgrimage for the Slovene men and women alike.

Trubar, as Dr. Gruden writes, of course saw only fraud, trickery and selfishness in all this because he thought that the pilgrim churches only "arose because of these devil's own females, and those priests, monks, provosts and sacristans helped them only because of their greed."

A Word to the Wise

There is no doubt that the average motorist today is a better driver than was the average motorist a few years ago. He has a better appreciation of traffic hazards and of the limitations of an automobile. The man on foot however remains unperturbed about traffic dangers so the motorist must use extra care to avoid accidents.

When a pedestrian is crossing the street in the path of your car be prepared for anything. He may just stand there or he may become confused and start hurrying in any direction. You can never take it for granted that he will have time or inclination to get out of the way.

In case you see a person standing at the edge of the road be on the alert for he may suddenly step into the path of your car. Be particularly careful when passing other cars or vehicles that obstruct your view, pedestrians are apt to dart from behind. It is necessary to have your car under complete control to avoid an accident in such an emergency.

Another danger area is at safety zones and street car stops. The person on foot sometimes completely ignores the rights of the motorist. Try to be prepared for this possibility as you pass occupied zones. Remember that alertness and care can save you from an accident you would regret the balance of your life even though you were not held responsible.
