LONDON, 15. avg. — Angli-
jska vlada je pripravljena udele-
žiti se mirovnih pogajanj z
Nemčijo in Italijo, toda le s po-
močjo, če se najde formula, s
katero se bo Poljska zadovolji-
la. Tako je bilo danes rečeno
med angleških uradnih krogih.
LONDON, 15. avg. — Tajni-
ski Lige narodov še ne ve nič
o kakšnih razgovorih komi-
teta dr. Burckhardta v Gdan-
sku. Hitlerjem, je pa priprav-
ljeno oddati protekcijo Lige nar-
odov nad Gdanskom, ako Po-
lska odobri ta korak.

LONDON, 15. avg. — Iz Rima
prilila neuradna vest, da sta
Nemčija in Italija dogovorili
skupne dni na konferencah v
Berghofu in Berghofu, da po-
sta Poljski, Angliji in Fran-
ciji "premirje" za 30 dni pod
pogojem, da Poljska, Anglija
in Francija v tem času prista-
vijo na "mirovno" konferenco,
kateri bo petorica najprvo
predlagala vprašanje Gdanska,
in pa še druge evropske
probleme.

Nemčija in Italija naprosita
Pija XII., naj on kot nati-
onski "kneza miru" formalno
odloči "mirovno" konferenco.
Med tem se je izvedelo, da je
dr. Burckhardt, komisar Lige nar-
odov v Gdanku, naj posredu-
je Poljsko in njenima za-
povednikom ter Nemčijo in Ita-
lijo glede gdanskega vprašanja.
Dr. Burckhardt, švicarski pro-
stovoljec, je ob koncu zadnjega ted-
na konferiral s Hitlerjem o
novem predlogu za posredno-
st.

Diplomatični krogi v Londonu
Parizu so na jasno, da no-
vemu skemu dveh fašističnih dik-
tatorjev je v bistvu ponovitev
monakove konference v Monako-
ju, ko sta Hitler in Mussolini
zavzela Chamberlaina in Da-
lerja za uničenje čehoslov-
ske republike. Zdaj se nekaj
čezga pripravlja za "likvida-
cijo" Gdanska in koridorja.

Rimska vest se glasi, da Ita-
lija in Nemčija želita mirno re-
ševanje spora s Poljaki in sta pri-
pravljene na "kompromis", ki
mora biti takšen, da ne bo tr-
gala čast Nemčije. Ta "kom-
promis" bi bil, da Nemčija mir-
no odstopi Gdansk in pas zem-
lje v koridorju do Vzhodne Pru-
sije. Poljska pa obdrži svoje
ekonomske privilegije v Gdan-
sku, katere ji bo Nemčija za-
stala. Ako se ta "kompromis"
posreči, potem bosta Hit-
ler in Mussolini sprožila vpra-
šanje Gornje Šlezije, kjer so
negativni premogovniki. Nemčija
potrebuje te premogovnike, ka-
rje potrebuje premogovnike v
Poljski Tesina, katere so si Po-
lski prilaščili od Čehov lanske
zime.

O vsem tem sta razpravljala
Hitler in gdanski komisar Lige
narodov, zdaj pa ima komisar
poljskega, da to sporoči poljski
vladi in predstavnikom Anglije
in Francije. Med tem pa bo
Hitler držal svojo mobilizirano
armado dveh milijonov mož pri-
praveno kot strašilo. Kje
se nalaga on in Mussolini uprizoriti
drugi Monakovo, še ni znano,
vendar pa mora biti nekje v
Nemčiji, kjer se bodo lahko vr-
šile mogočne nemške vojaške
parade pred očmi angleških in
francoskih "mirovnih" delega-
tov in potrebne psihološke name-
re. V Varšavi je prišla vest, da
je zunanji minister Beck sicer

stov odšel v Moskvo.

mlad leta 1937 ob povratku v

li iz Španije med civilno vojno
in polovica teh je bila ameri-

Roosevelt udaril po lastnih torijih

Vidi poraz
če bo nominiran
konservativec

Washington. — (FP) — De-
mokratska stranka bo poražena
pri prihodnjih volitvah, če bo no-
minirala konservativnega kan-
didata ali pa človeka, ki bo li-
beralen le na jeziku. Tega mne-
nja je predsednik Roosevelt, ki
je posvaril mlade demokrate, ki
so zadnje dni zborovali v Pitts-
burghu.

"Ne nasedajte reakcionarjem
in njih lepim frazam," je rekel
Roosevelt v svoji poslanici kon-
venciji, v kateri je dal razume-
ti, da se bo boril za nominiranje
liberalnega kandidata demokratske
stranke. "Pritisnite jih v kot
in zahtevajte od njih, da vam
povedo, kaj in kako bi oni
napravili. Demokratska stran-
ka bo poražena, če bo prihodnje
leto postala konservativna, ali
pa če jo bodo vodili ljudje, ki
imajo lepe besede, le na jezi-
ku. Demokratska stranka
stranka bi prenehala biti efek-
tivna sila v državi, ako bodo vo-
lilci prisiljeni izbrati med re-
publikanskim "Tweedle Du-
mom" in demokratskim "Tweed-
le Dummerjem". Ako nomi-
ramo konservativne kandidate
na dvomni platformi, ali pa
kandidate, ki bodo imeli le je-
zik, tedaj že radi lastnega re-
pekta, kot človek, ki že dolgo let
služi in veruje v liberalno de-
mokracijo, ne bom aktivno so-
deloval pri nevarnem samomo-
ru demokratske stranke," je
rekel predsednik.

Roosevelt je izrazil upanje,
da se to ne bo zgodilo in da bo
demokratska konvencija zopet
osvojila program za nadaljevanje
liberalne in humanitarne
vlade. Oplasil je indirektno tu-
di torije v demokratski stranki.

ference. Gradi jo Cooperative
Refinery Assn. iz N. Kansas
Cityja, Mo.

Temeljni kamen je položil
Neil S. Beaton, predsednik Scot-
tish Cooperative Wholesale So-
ciety, v družbi Johna Macken-
zieja, direktorja te britske ve-
lezadruga, ki sta prinesla po-
zdrave od 900.000 zadrugarjev
iz Skotije. Stavbniče, 80 akrov
zemlje, je podarilo meteo. Ob
tej priliki so zadrugarji pokupi-
li za osem tisoč dolarjev delnic
v osmih minutah. Delničarja
tega zadruga podjetja sta
postala tudi Beaton in Macken-

SPORAZUM ZA ODPRAVOSTAVK PRI GRADNJAH

Kontraktorji in unije
ADF sklenile novo
pogodbo

KORAK PROTI CIO

Washington. — (FP) — Za-
stopniki splošne zveze kontrak-
torjev in gradbenega depart-
menta ADF so sklenili nov spo-
razum za odpravo juridičelj-
skih stavk pri gradbenih pro-
jektih. Te stavke, v katerih so
delavci stavkali proti delavcem,
so stare institucije v okviru
gradbenih unijske ADF. Storjenih
je bilo že več poskusov za njih
odpravo, toda do sedaj brez
uspeha.

Nov sporazum določa, da mo-
rajo v primeri juridičeljske
stavke predsedniki vseh priza-
detih mednarodnih unijske takoj
poslati delavce nazaj na delo,
sporno vprašanje pa reši pre-
sednik gradbenega departmen-
ta ADF. Vse unije so se zave-
zale, da se bodo držale njegove-
ga odloka.

Sporazum dalje tudi določa,
da v primeri juridičeljskega
spora obdrži sporno delo tisti
delavci, ki so ga opravljali
pred sporom. Do stavke tudi
ne sme priti, dokler ni delo na
posloplju ali pri projektu izgo-
tovljeno. V slučaju, ako med-
na pogodba poteče prej, nado-
ljujejo z delom naprej po stari
lestvici.

Ta sporazum je potrdila tudi
ekskutiva Ameriške delavske
federacije, ki sedaj zboruje v
Atlantic Cityju. Opazovalci me-
nijo, da je do tega sporazuma
prišlo radi koraka CIO, s ka-
terim se je odločil, da bo prišel
ustanovljati dualne unije tudi v
gradbeni industriji, oziroma je
ustanovil industrijske unije o
gradbenih delavcev, v katero naj
spadajo vse stroke. Lewis je
izjavil, da ta unija ne bo trpela
juridičeljskih sporov. Na čelo
te unije oziroma organizato-
ričnega odbora je Lewis postavil
svojega brata.

Voditelji gradbenih unijske
tako obsojili ta Lewisov korak
in med vrticami zagrozili CIO
s krvavim bojem, ako se bo sku-
šal urediti v gradbeno indus-
trijo. Lewis je rekel, da je CIO
storil ta korak na apel grad-
benih delavcev in da bo skušal or-
ganizirati te tiste, ki so izven or-
ganizacij.

Nekateri poznavalci situacije
so menja, da je Lewis storil ta
korak kot strategično potezo,
katere namen je, da prisili vo-
ditelje gradbenih unijske, da pri-
stanejo na združenje CIO in
ADF po pogojih, ki bodo ugod-
ni za industrijske unije.

In our Neighborhood On Sunday last the Chicago Caschs staged another large demonstration. The parade was over a mile long. It made its way down 28th street and into Pilsen Park. National costumes were the order of the day from the little tots up to the older men and women. There were banners, displays, music; a great number of organizations participated.

The park was too small to accommodate the crowds that followed the parade. Huddled side by side they stood in the hot sun and listened eagerly to the speakers vowing continued aid to the Czechoslovak victims. Represented also was a speaker in behalf of Yugoslavia, one for Korea, and the secretary of the anti-Nazi German-American League for Culture.

Throughout the audience copies of a new song were distributed—words by Vojta Benes and music by Frank Kubina—"Zvitezme!" Singing society Lara led the mass singing:

"... Toš Českoslováci z Pennsylván-
ských hor,
z Illinois, Minnesoty, zdvihnete
svůj vzor,
za zrazený národ svůj do boje,
Kanado, Dakoty, Texase seloný,
farmari z Nebraska, vsáhnu
praporek nad hlavu,
posvátne vaše vlast,
Maasryk věčný je,
otroctví pomine,
svět drake zlého zabije!
Zvitezme!
Náš v boj — —!"

All of this may not mean much to some of you living in Minnesota, Ohio, Seattle, Washington, and all the territory in between. But consider:

Not so long ago there were mass meetings equally fervent in behalf of the Spanish Loyalists. Many then paid no attention because Spain was so far away and it was also far away from their own European homeland.

Then the Chinese began imploring for a world consciousness of human decency, and that seemed even more remote.

Of course, pleading the cause of the persecuted Jews has become common information even to those who never listen to the radio nor read the newspapers, but there have been so many so-called "progressive" men among us who have felt that "well, the Jew is not one of our people, anyway."

But it may not be so many weeks in the future when the Yugoslavs, too, may be staging demonstrations and calling upon the fellow countrymen "to give and give financial aid until it hurts" for Yugoslav victims of terrorism.

For those to whom all this still be too far away to affect us, there are the conditions within our very localities that are breeding grounds for situations that may eventually strike us right where we are.

To an audience of about 500 in a North side settlement house Friday last the speaker was announcing an important meeting of relief workers that was to be held this week. "Ninety per cent of all the people in this neighborhood are on relief," he said. "Ninety per cent!" And they are proposing to cut relief, when what we need is more," he continued.

In Federation conference a few have been found who participate on a balanced scale in discussions. Jim Maglich of the E. S. Federation has a sense of balance. Veteran Federation attendants have often seen Jim take in discussions. Once in a while he steps in. There is had an analysis of the discussion. John Kumer used to have that sense of balance. Frank Kress, when he presided at conferences, first called attention to John's assets. John was one of the few who could make an attempt, and admit it, that the question has more views than any one side can give, or gave. In Revelier ranks there is Martin Spee. 1940 SNPJ Day
CHICAGO.—All Eastern Lodges and Federations who plan to bid for the 1940 SNPJ Day must have their bids sent to me by Aug. 21, 1939. Also all lodges that have representatives present at the meeting in La Salle, Ill., Monday, Sept. 4, are urged to have representatives with credentials, to be eligible to vote for the 1940 SNPJ Day.

Eligibility List
Names and certificate numbers of all players and teams who expect to compete in the SNPJ championship must be sent to the SNPJ office for approval at least 3 weeks before the SNPJ Day, by the Secretary of the Lodge. To date the following Lodges have sent in their list: Triglav and Friendly City of Johnstown, Strugglers of Cleveland, and Young Americans and Wolverines of Detroit. All the others who have a chance of winning their District Championship are urged to send in their list at once, or they will not be eligible to compete for the Championship in La Salle.

Transportation
The teams that travel to La Salle, Ill., for the finals will be paid the regular railroad fare by the SNPJ, whether they travel by R. R. or not. This money will not be paid until after the celebration. If all the teams traveling to La Salle will have the exact expense of R. R. fare at La Salle, the bill can be sent to the National Office at once, which will mean that by that week-end the teams will have received their money. Each team will be paid for 15 players including manager.

District Winners
Every District must have a winner determined by August 28, or that District will not be represented in the National Championship. All leagues have their season closing 3 weeks prior to Labor Day, so in two weeks all postponed games that have any bearing on the District Championship must be played. If more than one team finishes the regular league schedule in a tie for first place, the tied teams must play off in that time, as the SNPJ is paying expenses of only one team from each of the four Districts.

None of the District winners are known to the writer at the present time but barring upsets in the two remaining games the Badgers of Milwaukee will represent the Midwest League. The Young Americans defeated the Wolverines, both of Detroit, who meet the Strugglers of Cleveland by virtue of their victory over the Loyalties. SNPJ FINANCE COMMITTEE

Meeting of July 15, 1939

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Petrovich at 8 a. m. In attendance were all seven members of the Committee.

Minutes of the June 17 meeting were approved with the addition of the following statement by Brother Vidar: That the vote of the minority members of the Committee was not in any way affected by the subsequent reverse decisions with respect to the loan on the Slovene Workers' Home in Cleveland.

Petrovich submitted the following report: Moody's letter with regards to the State of Louisiana Highway Bonds explaining the various issues of these bonds—Moody's did not recommend their purchase because they were of a late series; Moody's letter in which they reviewed municipal investments explaining why they were against the purchase of long term bonds at this time. Both letters were placed on file. The partial financial report on Charles W. Harrah Corporation submitted by Moody's Service was read and filed.

In connection with the above investment of \$15,000, Brother Vidar read a letter from the Public Trust Commission of the State of Michigan with regards to delinquent taxes. They urge the Society to make arrangements to pay these taxes. It was unanimously agreed to secure further information from the Guardian Trust Company on these bonds.

Moody's letter explaining the situation of the City of Memphis and the TVA with respect to revenue, advising the use of caution in the purchase of these bonds, was read and filed. A letter from M. B. Vick and Co., with regards to the Holmes County, Mississippi District 5 bonds in the amount of \$36,000 was read and filed. M. B. Vick and Co. advise that Brevard County, special road and bridge district 6, could be sold at about 92, and by unanimous consent, these bonds were ordered sold at 92 or better.

The letter was signed by the President, Secretary and Treasurer of the Board. It was duly moved, seconded and carried that the furnace in the building be repaired and that the cost of the repairs be added to purchase price.

A letter from mortgagor 17 explaining that he could not raise the required amount requested to pay off his mortgage, but that he could secure \$3000, was read and the Committee unanimously decided to remain at its previous decision. A letter from Andy Unetich with regards to the Kileek and Vukainich properties was read and placed on file; the Secretary was instructed to advise him to list the Vukainich property for sale with one of the real estate dealers.

A letter from Philip B. Heller with regards to our \$35,000 investment in the La Salle Building Corporation, 29 So. La Salle Street, was read. The Corporation is liquidating. A motion was carried to postpone the acceptance of this offer and to mail a copy of Heller's letter to each member of the Committee for study. A report of operations for the first six months of 1939 on the Racine Hotel Corporation was read. No interest will be paid for this period. The letter was placed on file.

The following report was made by Brother Vogrich: The Strauss Security Corporation offered to buy a number of our bonds. The offer was placed on file. The matter of interest arrearage on the City National Bank Building has been settled. Invested during the month as follows:

U. S. Government Bonds—From C. F. Childs & Co. \$42,950 2 1/4 % maturity, 1965.

Consumers Power—From The First Boston Corporation—\$26,522.50 3 1/4 % yield 3.12.

On July 1, Miami, Arizona, called and paid off one \$1000 bond. Bradford County, Florida, called and paid off \$25,000 of our bonds. The \$5000 Tarboro, North Carolina, bonds matured and were paid. The \$2000 Shelby County, Texas, road district bonds matured and were paid.

The \$2000 Key West, Florida, bonds were refunded with extension of maturity to 1973 and reduction of interest on a scale of from 2 to 5%.

We have \$85,000 to invest this month.

F. A. Vidar added the following to his report: A letter from Crummer and Company with regards to the refunding of Highland, Florida, bonds on a par for par basis with a reduction in interest to 4%. It was agreed to ask Moody's for information and advice on this matter.
