DUNAJ SPREJEL HITLERJA KOT ZMAGOVALCA

Nobena sila ne zlomi no- vega nemškega imperi- ja, pravi diktator

ZIDJE BEZIJO IZ AV- STRIJE

Dunaj, 15. marca. — Diktator Hitler je včeraj dospel na Dunaj, v mesto, katerega je zapustil pred 25 leti, kot zmagovalca. Zvonovi vseh cerkva so na ukaz kardinala Innitzerja zvonili, ko je Hitler s svojim spremstvom triumfalno prišel v mesto. Enajst oklopnih avtomobilov in okrog 50 drugih se je pomikalo po ulicah pred onim, v katerem sta sedela Hitler in dr. Arthur Seyas-Inquart, ki je postal predsednik avstrijske vlade po strmoglavljenju režima kancelarja Schuschnigga, dočim so v zraku krožila nemška bojna letala. Ob ulicah, po katerih so se vozili Hitler, visoki vojaški častniki in voditelji nacistične stranke, se je zbrala množica in pravdravljala Hitlerja kot človeka, v čigar rokah je bodoča usoda avstrijskega prebivalstva.

Proccesija se je ustvarila pred hotelom Imperial, v katerem se je Hitler nastanil s svojim spremstvom. Z balkona tega hotela je potem Hitler govoril zbrani množici. "Kar vi čutite, sem jaz čutil že dolgo," je rekel diktator. "Prišla je velika izprememba. Kar vidi dva milijona prebivalcev Dunaja, vidi tudi 75,000,000 Nemcev, ki tvorijo zdaj eno državo. Gotov sem, da ni nobene sile na svetu, ki bi mogla uničiti novo Nemčijo, ki se razteza od Kraljevega Gradca do Kolina in od Hamburga do Dunaja."

Glavni govor bo imel Hitler danes, ko se bodo obnovile proslave združenja Avstrije z Nemčijo. Prebivalci so že dobili navodila, naj razbesijo nacistične zastave s svastiko. Vse ceremonije, ki se bodo vršile danes, bo nadzirala policija in vojaštvo, ki je prišlo na Dunaj iz Nemčije.

Dunaj, 15. marca. — Več tisoč židov je že pobegnilo iz Avstrije v bojazni pred nacistično persekucijo. Židovski distrikt Leopoldstadt na Dunaju sliši pokopalski zvone. Židje se skrivajo v svojih hišah in trgovinah, dočim po ulicah tega distrikta odmevajo koraki oboževanih nacistov.

Dr. Heinrich Neuman, sloviti židovski zdravnik, ki je dvakrat zdravil bivšega angleškega kralja Edvard VIII., je bil aretiran. Poleg njega je bilo aretiranih več drugih bogatih židov, ki so pod pritiskom prispevali velike vsote v sklad domovinske fronte. Schuschniggove vlade stranke. Veliko židovskih trgovin in kavarn je zaprlo vrata. Bratje Schiffmann, lastniki židovske veletrgovine na Dunaju, so bili aretirani na obtožbo kršenja denarnih zakonov.

Avtstrijski odbor ustanovljen v Parizu

Pariz, 15. marca. — Grupa avstrijskih državljancev, ki prebiva v Parizu in med katerimi je tudi Hirsch Montmartin, ki je resigniral kot avstrijski generalni konzul, je naznanila ustanovitev splošnega odbora, ki se bo boril za svobodno in neodvisno Avstrijo. Ta odbor bo ustanovljal slične organizacije po vsem svetu.

Solnograd proslavlja zvezo z Nemčijo

Solnograd, 15. marca. — Zgodovinski Solnograd na avstrijski strani, kjer je bila zadnji teden še meja med Avstrijo in Nemčijo, je sinoči proslavil zvezo z Nemčijo z uničenjem mejnih lesene drogove, ki so zaznamovali mejo, so člani mladinske organizacije znošili na kup in zažgali.

Naciji odbili ponudbo češke vlade

Henlein noče pozicije v kabinetu

Berlin, 15. marca. — Medtem, ko nacija proslavlja združitev 75,000,000 Nemcev, ki je prišla, ko je Nemčija anektirala Avstrijo, so se začeli zbirati temni oblaki nad Češkoslovaško. Konrad Henlein, vodja nacijev v nemški sekciji Češkoslovaške, je včeraj informiral nemškega zunanjega ministra Joachima von Ribbentropa, da so mu Čehi ponudili pozicijo v kabinetu, minister pa mu je takoj svetoval, naj odkloni ponudbo. Ribbentropova akcija je dokaz, da se bodo nacija posluževali slične taktike proti Češkoslovaški kakor proti Avstriji, čeprav je prej v razgovoru s češkimi, francoskimi in angleškimi diplomati dal zagotovilo, da bo Nemčija le ščitila pravice nemške manjšine v Češkoslovaški in da ji ne preti nevarnost napada s strani nacijev.

Praga, 15. marca. — Ferdinand Marek, avstrijski poslanik v Pragi od l. 1918, je odpotoval v Avstrijo in se ne bo več vrnil v Prago. S poslopja avstrijskega poslaništva zdaj vihra zastava s kljukastim križem. Straže ob češko-avstrijski meji so bile včeraj ojačane. Avtorite so prepovedale vrnitev v Avstrijo celo ljudem, ki živijo v Češkoslovaški, a so avstrijski državljani.

Zidje apelirajo na Ligo narodov

Zeneva, 15. marca. — Izvršni svet svetovnega židovskega kongresa je sinoči apeliral na svet Lige narodov, naj štiti židve v Avstriji na podlagi pogodbe, ki je bila sklenjena v St. Germainu. Kongres je tudi apeliral na vse civilizirane države, naj preprečijo nacistično persekucijo židov.

Washington informiran, da Avstrije ni več

Washington, D. C., 15. marca. — Diplomatični odnosi med Združenimi državami in Avstrijo so bili dramatično končani sinoči, ko je dr. Hans Heinrich Dieckhoff, nemški poslanik v Washingtonu, informiral državnega tajnika Hulla, da je Avstrija kot država izginila. Poslanik je izročil državnemu tajniku tudi kopije dekretov, ki so bili izdani v Lincu in na Dunaju, da je Avstrija postala del Nemčije. Pred uradom nemškega poslanika se je včeraj zbrala množica demonstrantov, ki je kričala: "Proč s Hitlerjem!" Čez 40 demonstrantov je policija aretirala.

FRANCIJA POD- PRE ČEŠKO ZOBO- ROŽENO SILO

Blumova vlada bo štiti neodvisnost svoje zaveznice

KONFERENCA DIPLOMATOV V PARIZU

Pariz, 15. marca. — Leon Blum, vodja socialistov in predsednik francoske vlade, je včeraj izjavil, da je Francija pripravljena rabiti oboženo silo, da zaščití Češkoslovaško in mir v Evropi. Premier in zunanji minister Joseph Paul-Boncour sta zagotovila češkoslovaškega poslanika Štefana Osuškega v Parizu, da bo Francija podvela militaristično akcijo v soglasju s sklenjeno pogodbo vzajemne vojaške pomoči, če bo nacija Nemčija skušala podjarmiti Češkoslovaško.

Francija je ponovno dobila vlado ljudske fronte, ki pa je že naletela na opozicijo, ko je vrednot franka spet padla. Konservativci v senatu nasprotujejo novi vladi, v kateri so socialisti in socialni radikali. Oni hočejo kabinet narodne enotnosti, v katerem bi bile reprezentirane vse politične stranke. Opozicija je zlasti velika proti zunanjemu ministru Paul-Boncourju, ki sovrvači italijanske fašiste. To — pravijo kritiki — lahko ovira razgovore med Anglijo in Italijo glede sklenitve sporazuma.

Podjarmljenje Avstrije po Nemčiji je Francija sprejela kot dejstvo, ki ga mora priznati, na drugi strani pa se je odločila, da prepreči "nacistično" Češkoslovaško, svoje zaveznice. Blum in zunanji minister Paul-Boncour sta po sestanku s češkim poslanikom naznanila, da sta pozvala francoske poslanike v Bruslju, Pragi in na Dunaju v Pariz, da se posvetujeta z njimi.

Francoski diplomatje zasledujejo debate v angleškem parlamentu, ki kažejo, da bo Velika Britanija zavzela slično stališče kot Francija v slučaju, da nacistična Nemčija napade Češkoslovaško. Dasi angleški premier Chamberlain nastopa previdno, je vaeeno jasno, da tudi Anglija ne bo pustila Češkoslovaške na cedilu. Vojaški krogi pravijo, da je francoska obožena sila pripravljena na vse eventualnosti in da ne bo dovolila nadaljnje ekspanzije nacije Nemčije.

Japonci sestrelili rusk o letalo

Napad na ameriško misionarsko postajo

Tokio, 15. marca. — Prvič, odkar je izbruhnila vojna med Japonsko in Kitajsko, so Japonci v bitki v zraku, ki se je vršila nad mestom Pukov, razbili letalo, ki ga je pilotar ruski letalec. Japonci so se spoprijeli z velikim številom ruskih letalcev, ki so leteli v smeri proti Nankingu.

Sanghaj, 15. marca. — Kitajska časopisna agencija poroča, da so japonski letalci včeraj napadli s bombami ameriške in nemške misionarske postaje v Tenghsienju, v mestu, ki leži v južnem delu province Santung. Koliko ljudi je bilo ubitih in ranjenih v tem napadu, poročilo ne omenja.

Imeli to leto večje število ter da bi naša društva in federacije po drugih krajih in nasebinah pridno posnemala naše podjetne Waukegančane.

Fašistična arma- da se bliža morju

Spanska vlada priznala padec važnega mesta

Hendaye, Francija, 15. marca. — Fašistične čete so pri svojem prodiranju proti Sredozemskemu morju pretrgali lojalistično obrambno črto v več krajih in vse kaže, da bodo razcepile ozemlje, ki ga kontrolira španska ljudska vlada, na dve polovici. Včeraj so prodri več milj daleč in prve kolone so oddaljene le okrog 45 milj od Sredozemskega morja. Španska vlada je včeraj priznala, da so uporniki zasedli strateško mesto Alcaniz. S tem so dobili kontrolo nad omrežjem cest, ki spajajo obrežno ozemlje s Teruelom in Zaragozo, mestoma, ki sta v fašističnih rokah. Cilj fašistične ofenzive, ki traja že več dni, je izolacija severnega dela Katalonije, odrezanje Valencije, pristaniškega mesta, od Madrida.

V fašistični ofenzivi sodelujejo italijanske čete in Maročani. Fašistični letalci so včeraj bombardirali postojanke lojalistov na aragonski fronti. Poročilo se glasi, da se lojalisti stalno umikajo.

Barcelona, 15. marca. — Fašistični letalci so včeraj napadli s bombami in potopili španski tovorni parnik Isla de Menorca, ko se je nahajal 50 milj od obrežja. Ali so člani posadke utonili, ko se je parnik potopil, ni znano.

Anglija pospeši oboževanje

Konskripcija angleške mladine

London, 15. marca. — Ministrski predsednik Neville Chamberlain je včeraj opozoril mladino, naj bo pripravljena na vstop v armado, poleg tega pa je napovedal poslabšanje gospodarskih razmer kot posledico Hitlerjeve taktike, katere se je poslužil pri podjarmljenju Avstrije. Chamberlain je govoril v parlamentu o potrebi konskripcije mladih fantov. Ti se morajo izuriti v rabi orožja v soglasju s programom, ki ga je parlament že odobrila in kateri določa, da Anglija potroši \$7,500,000 za ojačanje svoje obožene sile.

Po premierjevem govoru, ki jo zaključil osem ur trajajočo debato v parlamentu, se je oglašal Richard Butler, podminister za zunanje zadeve. On je dejal, da je v načrtu poleg mobilizacije mladih fantov tudi mobilizacija industrij, kar bo pospešilo oboževanje.

Predno je bila debata zaključena se je pred parlamentom zbrala velika množica in kričala "Chamberlain se mora umakniti. Naciji morajo izgniti iz Londona. Proč s fašistično vlado!" Policija na konjih je bila nato pozvana v akcijo, da razprši demonstrante.

Chamberlainu so ploskali, ko je kritiziral odgovor Nemčije na protest, ki ga je njegova vlada naslovila Hitlerju zadnji petek zaradi nacistične invazije Avstrije. Odgovor je poslal Angliji baron Konstantin von Neurath, načelnik nemškega tajnega sveta za zunanje zadeve, v katerem je bilo rečeno, da Anglija se ne bi smela vmešavati v zadeve centralne Evrope. Chamberlain je dejal, da ima Velika Britanija interese tudi v centralni Evropi in vsled tega je njena intervencija upravičena.

Svet unij CIO ustanovljen v Richmondu

Richmond, Va. — Delegati unij CIO so na svoji konferenci, na kateri so reprezentirali organizirane delavce v tekstilni, jeklarski, tobačni in drugih industrijah, ustanovili svet unij CIO v Richmondu. V teku je zdaj akcija, da se ustanovi državni svet unij CIO v Virginiji.

BRUTALNOST POLICIJE PROTI STAVKARJEM

Kongresnik Maverick se potegnil za luščilce orehov

JEČE POLNE STAVKARJEV

San Antonio, Tex. — (FP) — Teksaski kongresnik Mavery Maverick, vodja "mladih Turkov" v kongresu, je priskočil na pomoč pet tisoč luščilec orehov, ki so v stavki proti znižanju miserne plače že nad pet tednov. Stavkarjem je poslal telegram, v katerem jim zagotavlja svojo podporo.

Njegov telegram je takoj učinkoval tudi na javnost in na javne organe. Policija je takoj izpustila iz ječe 200 stavkarjev, katere je bila atlačila po 12 v luknje, v katerih je prostora le za štiri osebe. Vplival je tudi na javno mnenje, ki se je takoj pričelo oglašati proti izredni brutalnosti policije napram stavkarjem.

Luščilci pekanov ali orehov so zastavkali, ko so jim bošaje znižali že itak skrajno miserne plače za 20%. Prej so zaslužili od \$2.50 do šest dolarjev na teden (ameriški življenjski standard), znižanje pa je pomenilo, da bi prejemale kraljevske plače od \$1.68 do \$4 za teden dela!

Nič čudnega ni, če so se luščilci orehov uprli temu izkoriščanju in da vstrajajo v boju kljub nepopolnemu policijskemu terorju. Politična mašina v tem mestu, kakor v večini drugih, je popolnoma v rokah podjetnikov. In ko so se mehiški kuliji uprli izkoriščanju, so javni organi brutalno nastopili proti njim. Policija je mirne pikete pričela razganjati s plinskimi bombami in krepelci; voz za vozom jih je vlačila v ječo, vseh skupaj nad 500. In ko jih ni mogla več spraviti v ječo, jih je odpeljala 15 do 20 milj ven iz mesta, izpraznila avte in se odpeljala po druge. Stavkarji so se morali vrniti peš.

Italija ostane prijateljica Nemčije

Nacistični puč v Avstriji ograža mir, pravijo v Moskvi

Rim, 15. marca. — Mussolini je včeraj dal diktatorju Hitlerju osebno zagotovilo, da Italija ostane prijateljica Nemčije. V telegramu, ki ga je Mussolini poslal Hitlerju, pravi: "Moje stališče odloča prijateljstvo med obema državama, ki bazira na osi Rim-Berlin." Mussolinijev telegram je bil odgovor na Hitlerjevo poslanico, v kateri je slednji naglasil, "da ne bo nikdar pozabil prijateljskega stališča, ki ga je Mussolini zavzel glede anektiranja Avstrije."

V italijanskem fašističnem tisku, ki se je zavzemal za neodvisnost Avstrije do nacističnega puča, se opaža preokret. Vse od svetovne vojne sem se je Italija ponašala kot zaščitnica neodvisnosti Avstrije, ki je bila bistvena potreba varnosti italijanskih mej. Zdaj je Italija kar čez noč zavrgla to idejo. Bojazen pred "Anschlussom", svezem Avstrijo in Nemčijo, se je izpremenila v odobravanje.

Moskva, 15. marca. — Izvestija, glasilo sovjetske vlade, je včeraj obsodila Hitlerjevo okupacijo Avstrije kot gesto, ki ograža mir v Evropi. List vidi v tej okupaciji nevarnost nacistične invazije Češkoslovaške, zaveznice Sovjetske unije, zaeno pa naglašala, da Rusija mirno gleda na razvoj situacije in veri, da je sovjetsko ozemlje varno pred napadom nacistične Nemčije.



Prihodnji mesec bo naša jednota stara 34 let. Naša jednota se je rodila kot znak upora in glasnega protesta, obenem pa kot znak nove in bolj praktične zavarovalne združnosti med slovenskimi delavci v Ameriki.

Oni, ki so stali ob zibelci SNPJ in ki še žive, vedo, kaj je bila gonilna sila, ki je porodila našo jednoto. Bila je svobodna misel. V Ameriki je bilo že takrat na stotine slovenskih svobodomislecev, ki so hoteli imeti svoje časopise in svojo organizacijo. In ker so hoteli imeti svojo podporno organizacijo, so tudi hoteli, da bo njihova organizacija boljša kot katere druga, takrat obstoječa, in to so dosegli s sistemom centralne bolniške podpore.

Svobodna misel, katero je SNPJ takoj ob svoji ustanovitvi v aprilu 1904 osvojila kot svojo načelno podlago, leta 1907 (na svoji tretji konvenciji v La Salle) pa postavila na čelo svoje ustave, kjer še danes stoji, je podstava vsake prave demokracije. Supreme Secretary Answers Questions of Local Secretaries and Members

Questions About Cert. II of The Juvenile Department

QUESTION: Is a juvenile member after becoming insured under Cert. II immediately insured for \$1000 death benefit?

ANSWER: The death benefit insurance is gradually increased each year in the same manner as under the old form of insurance or the so-called Cert. I. For instance, if a member in his first year of age dies, the insurance paid would amount to \$20.00, but however, if he died in his 13th year, beneficiary would be entitled to \$700.00.

QUESTION: Upon transferring into the adult department, can a member insured in Cert. II for \$1000 retain this amount of insurance?

ANSWER: He may do so, but must be medically examined. Sec. 35 of the by-laws provides that any juvenile member transferring into the adult department and wishing to be insured for higher than \$500 death benefit and \$1.00 sick benefit Class must submit to and satisfactorily pass physical examination. Therefore, when one transfers from the juvenile to the adult department he must undergo a medical examination if he wishes to be insured for more than \$500 death benefit; also in case if he desires to be insured for \$2 daily sick benefit.

QUESTION: Does a juvenile member insured in Cert. II receive the amount of \$280 upon attaining the age of 16 years regardless when he joined?

ANSWER: No! If a child is entered in our Society before attaining the age of six months, upon reaching the age of 16 years he shall be entitled to the above mentioned sum. However, in case that he enters after 6 months of age, he shall be paid \$255 at the age of 16 years, and \$230 if he joins when he has been over 1 1/2 years old. You will note that the cash amount paid is based upon the age rate of a juvenile member.

NOTE: Recently we have mailed a new "Secretary's Guide" to all local lodge secretaries in which can be found details in regard to what juvenile and adult members are entitled after certain years of membership. The previous "Secretary's Guide" is null and void.

SNPJ Employees Sponsor Dance

CHICAGO, ILL.—The SNPJ office employees, all members of The United Office and Professional Workers Union, Local 24, CIO, are sponsoring a dance at the SNPJ lower hall on Saturday, March 19, for the benefit of the union treasury. The task of organizing the white collar group of workers, so long neglected, has proved to be a hard one. It takes money to print leaflets, hire organizers, and to do the many other necessary things when carrying on an organizational campaign. Comments On This and That

POLITICAL ADVERTISING IN PROSVETA

From time to time the editor receives a communication from a Society member announcing the candidacy of some person, usually a member of the SNPJ, for this or that political office.

Our by-laws forbid political advertising (see Section 34) in the Society publications. This means, of course, paid advertisements in the first place. But there is a form of "free advertising" under disguise of news items or letters; this should also fall under Section 34 of the by-laws.

The question arises: when is news just news, and when is news a free political advertisement? The by-laws are not specific on this point, but the law of common sense should tell us that any news item, or a communication, telling us in detail how this or that man or woman is running for a county sheriff, mayor, alderman, representative, or a member of the school board on the ticket of such and such a party is more an advertisement than just a news item. And more so when such a "news item" is repeated twice or three times in the paper.

Therefore, our line of demarcation between political advertisements and simple political news is thus:

A piece of news in any form giving the name of the candidate and the office for which he or she is running but omitting the political party or any other designation of the ticket may be considered as news, and it may be published freely in the Prosveta columns, provided, however, that such a piece of news is published only once. Our common rule is never to repeat the news under ordinary circumstances.

The Prosveta is not a political organ and serves no political party. However, the resolution embodying our organ's policy binds the editor to publish articles, communications, and news in favor of any genuine and democratically-inclined labor movement striving for political unity of the workers with the aim of arriving at an independent labor party, or farmer-labor party, which will have the abolition of capitalism for its goal. Any political candidates within this movement should have the support of the Prosveta.

It is very important then that we learn to distinguish between the individuals, the members of this Society or any others, running for political offices on an old party ticket and the labor political struggles. In the first case, we are interested in the individuals only inasmuch as they are members of the Society, but in the second case we are concerned with the principles mainly and not so much with the persons who happen to be candidates.

We do not believe in the goodness of the "good" men running on old party tickets. Individually, they may be all they maintain to be, but as cogs in a political machine they can be no better than the machine.

We hope the members who are interested in the political fortunes of their friends will understand our position and act accordingly.

DETROIT.—During a recent meeting of the Civil Rights Federation, of which the SNPJ Young American lodge is a member, a refusal was presented by the Detroit Board of Education for the use of Casa Technical High auditorium to protest the Scottsboro Case ruling on the grounds that it was a controversial issue. Golden Eagles

GIRARD, OHIO.—Recently Bernard M. Baruch, a prominent financier, was called to the Senate committee investigating causes of unemployment and he acted as was expected by defending the system of private initiative—the system that has for its basic principle the object of tremendous profits or "Either we make profits suitable to us or we don't work."

If we are to judge the soundness of this man's judgment let us bear in mind that he is a representative of the capitalistic group. Recent editorials gave the gentleman the benefits of wisdom and experience in presenting his statements. Looking at the declarations from his "side of the fence," we find that credit is due him—for his fundamental knowledge of the profit system is extensive and personally it has proven exceedingly fruitful. With this in mind, can we expect the man to favor policies that will eventually prove a detriment to the present set-up of which he is a member? Can we expect the man to advocate and approve corporation taxes and taxes on profits?

From what we have been able to gather, practically all of his discussion was about taxes. It appears that Mr. Baruch does not favor the present method of imposing the greatest tax on those who have the greatest income. Lately the trend has been more pronounced toward that direction. We believe that a general governmental sales tax would meet with his wholehearted approval. He does not want to tax the comparatively few who have but would rather tax the millions who have not.

Although some of the profit taxes have been in effect for some time, there has been no indication that profits have seriously decreased, at least not to the extent that it brought about a serious and potentially dangerous economic situation. We believe that the capitalistic concerns are peeved because they must share more of the tax burden than they have been accustomed to.

If the Senate committee really wants to receive some worthwhile ideas on the causes of the present

depression let them recruit some members from the working class—men who will relate practical and logical reasons and who can also submit concrete suggestions for a general betterment of conditions. They will mention the excessive use of labor-saving devices which benefit the company in the way of profits, the unnecessary haste in completing an order, again with profits as an objective and the uncalled for method of having a few men do the work of many, which brings about a loss of much needed purchasing power.

But the Hays office decided that if the film were made true to actual conditions it would lose money, because it would be banned in Germany. So they decided to change the storm troopers to communists. The producer then threatened to tear up the contract as well as the script.

Now a compromise has been effected. The film is to omit all scenes of oppression and violence against Jews and other racial minorities.—You can voice your protest by writing to Louis B. Mayer, Culver City, California, saying that you are against any misrepresentation or omission or alteration that would reverse the effect intended by the book, and that the conditions pointed out by the book should be presented.

Recommended Reading
In the March issue of the Forum magazine, there is an enlightening and revealing article written by a woman entitled, "Servants are Humans." It describes the plight of a woman in a city—any city for that matter—who sets out to do housework, or be housekeeper. It brings to your attention the self-made distinctions between "social classes." What a woman working in homes of more-than-average incomes is required to do and the insults she is subjected to oversteps the marks of decency and fair-dealing.

On Current Books
If you are looking for genuine and satisfying literature, the recent books "Action at Aquila" and "Northwest Passage" will not supply them for you. This statement comes from a Northwestern University professor and book critic. They are the same tales of adventure, excellent for juvenile minds, that have been hashed and reshaped since the beginning of the historical romances. The fact that they may head the list of best sellers need not mislead you. When you think that once upon a time "The Sheik" and "Mrs. Wiggs of the Cabbage Patch" and "Polyanna" also headed the list of best sellers, you will know how much you can rely on the trend of popular reading in America.

"Is Mother Love Unselfish?"
This topic could furnish material for an excellent debate in this column. The subject is discussed in the February issue of the Forum magazine. It brings to light another side of the much-taken-for-granted mother love. This is: that in a great many

cases, especially if the greatest of caution is not exercised, mother love is nothing more than a show of selfishness. Case after case is cited where the mother has dominated the life of her daughter or her son in such a way that it has been useful to her—to make her own position secure.

"The mother has made a living creature in her own image, out of her own flesh and blood, and she feels that it is hers to use, to profit by, just as she uses and profits by her own body and brain," reads one statement.

There are cases of sons so attached to the family that they dare not make a home of their own, for if they would, it would spell misery for the wife and themselves in turn. There are cases where the mother binds the daughter into marrying for wealth, thereby strengthening her own position of security. There are instances of every type of play upon emotions of the children, with the sole purpose of holding them under domination. Of course, there are also many cases of genuine mother love, but this manifests itself in an entirely different way.

Do you agree? Is this treading too harshly upon another long, well-established belief? Or are the interpretations wrong? Nevertheless, this is a thought, and one that presents "the other side of the picture."

Prepared under the direction of the medical consultants of Consumers Union, the pamphlet presents an unbiased, popular and educational study of the best positive advice that medical science can provide for the prevention and treatment of colds.

In addition to being a medical problem, the common cold is a social problem. It has been amply proven by the most recent report of the U. S. Public Health Service that all forms of illness, including colds, are more prevalent among the lower income and relief brackets (which comprise the majority of our population) than among the comparatively well-to-do. Unemployment, low wages, inadequate diet, slum housing, and harsh working conditions underlie the high prevalence of respiratory diseases in the low income brackets. The ultimate solution of the prevention and treatment of the common cold is not solely a matter of medical care but also of social organization. People in the low income brackets suffer additionally from mal-

Finance Committee Proceedings

November 20, 1937, Meeting.
 The meeting was called to order at 9 a. m. by Chairman Matt Petrovich. All of the members of the committee were present. Minutes of the previous meeting accepted with two clarifying corrections.

Petrovich reports on loan No. 22-A. He had hired a lawyer to remove tenants from property. Now it needed decorating, and after reading of bids it was agreed to have Brother Petrovich award the contract for the work.

Brother Vider reported as follows: 1. That the \$51,000.00 of FHA mortgages were not purchased from the Talman Building and Loan Association because they asked a premium of \$2.00 per hundred. Upon motion it was agreed to make another attempt to secure these mortgages at par, but without success. 2. A letter from Attorney Jones responding to our invitation to represent us in the matter of the West Matanzas Drainage District Bonds. He outlined the present condition and requested that we refrain from depositing our bonds. Letter placed on files as read. 3. Frank Zajec, Milwaukee, representative, submitted an offer for the loan No. 15-A property. Letter placed on file as read. 4. Mortgage expirations: a) Loan No. 142-A. Upon explanation it was agreed to seek FHA insurance on same before renewal. The following renewals were approved: b) Mortgage No. 144-A. c) Mortgage No. 148-A. d) Mortgage No. 52-J. e) Mortgage No. 53-J. The Six Point Realty Co. October financial statement was read and placed on file.

It was agreed that copies of those minutes be sent to all Supreme Board members.

Brother Vogrich reported on the following: 1. A letter from the Southern Development Co. regarding taxes and sales possibilities of the parcels of land we hold. 2. Pasadena, California, Bonds which the taxpayers of that community wish to recall at par, were ordered held upon advice of Moody's Service. 3. There was no change in the status of Edinburg bonds. 4. Speers & Co. offer to take our Tessville bonds in exchange for West Palm Beach, Florida, bonds. Upon advice of Moody's offer was not accepted.

New Investments. 1. Vider recommended that we purchase \$10,000.00 of U. S. Governments, 2 1/2% 1949-53 maturity to yield 2.57. Upon explanation that the prinary needed liquid assets, it was unanimously agreed to buy these bonds. There was quite some discussion on the manner in which bonds should be purchased. Lotrich stressed the need to determine what bonds we wanted first of all and then ask all the bond houses for their best quotations. Olip advised that such was the practice of one of the early Finance Committees but that it proved unpractical, undesirable and unprofitable because bond houses would manipulate such deals for their own benefit. Oftentimes we weren't able to purchase what we wanted because of that system and the subsequent manipulations. Oftentimes bond firms refused to bid because of these manipulations. Zupan affirmed Olip's remarks. Petrovich thought the present system of awarding orders very satisfactory. The system is as follows: Bond firms are advised to send their best offers on the best bonds which they possess or which they can deliver to each of the members of the Finance Committee, and we pick from the lot what we desire. It was agreed to continue this present system.

The following bonds were selected: 1. \$30,000 Kansas City, Mo., 2 1/2% 1973-4-5 maturity, yield 3.05. Unanimously approved to be purchased from Stranahan, Harris Company.

Unanimously approved to be purchased from the First Boston Co., or Stranahan Harris & Co., and Channer Company. 4. \$10,000 U. S. Government. Voting for: Cankar, Lotrich, Petrovich, Vider and Zupan. Olip and Vogrich voted for Los Angeles Power and Light.

Zupan explained that he wouldn't be able to attend the next meeting on December 18 due to the rush at the postoffice. He moved that the next meeting of this Committee be held on December 11. The motion was defeated by a 4 to 3 vote.

Olip's motion to postpone action on the sale of bonds until the December meeting, carried. Cankar reported on the Hrvatski Dom plumbing, heating and sewerage requirements. The meeting was adjourned at 4 p. m.
