Vtisi z naših proslav

Glasilo KSKJ od zadnjega tedna pa pravi, da mora Prosveta to popraviti, kajti delegatje prve konvencije KSKJ so bili civilno oblečeni, res pa je, da so bili na drugi konvenciji te jednote v Towerju, Minn., leta 1896 od trinajstih delegatov trije v uniformi in s sabljami.

Pisec zgodovinskega pregleda SNPJ se dobro spominja, da je neke videl sliko ene prvih konvencij KSKJ z delegati v uniformah, ne more pa reči, da li je bila to prva ali druga konvencija. Tudi rdeče srčice bi ne pomenile doati — nosil jih ni še nihče razen garibaldijevcev v Italiji — in Prosveta jih ne bi prav nič hvalila, zato je tišta opomba nesmiselna.

Hitler je določil nagrade za otroke. Prva dva otoka sta brez nagrade, za tretjega je pa že določena stipendija okrog \$10 mesečno, če so starši revni. Nagrade za otroke bo država plačevala iz fonda davkov, ki jih morajo plačevati znanci in samke.

Pri Slovencih je bilo na stanovanju nekaj mladih dalmatinskih fantov, med temi Nikola Sabolič, ki je bil izurjen v računalstvu in pisavi. Njega sem prosil, naj prevzame tajništvo novega društva, za kar bo dobil od jednjake zlat prstan kot ustanovitelj. Prvičkrat je namreč jednota dajala zlate prstane v vrednosti do dolarjev ustanoviteljem dru-

Na 11. novembra smo se resenili pri rojaku Kovaču. Jaz kot diktator sem že vse prej urejal, kaj naj kdo predlaga in kdo naj bo izvoljen v društveni odbor. Bila je skupina mladih fantov, ki je sejo hitro končala tako je bilo ustanovljeno novo društvo s trinajstimi člani. Društvo se imenovalo "Jutranja zora". Društvo je dobilo št. 54. Od ustanoviteljev je še samo Frank član društva.

Po seji smo nastavili sodček, kar je bil star običaj po vseh naselbinah. Nikola Sabolič je dobil zlat prstan od poznega diktatorja "Franka" pa ni prejel nikake nagrade. On je bil tajnik le nekaj mesecev in je odšel iz tega kraja, sem prevzel tajništvo, ker ga ni bilo nihče drugi. Tajniške posle sem opravljal osem let, dokler nisem šel v stari kraj na delo.

VIII

Leta 1905 smo na Glencoe ustanovili klub št. 2 JSZ. Ta klub bil precej aktiven in velika organizacija. V času, ko je v jedrni divjal največji notranji boj, sem poslal precej obširno pismo člankom socialistom predno izdali poziv za ustanovitev socialističnega lista. V pismu sem namizno željo, naj se boj z Glasom ubode ustavi, ker bo novi list kralj zadušen, ako se boj ne namreč prepričani, ako socialisti ustanove nov list, da bo postal glasilo SNPJ. Največji boji so bili v letih od leta do četrte konvencije, ko je slednja konvencija sodelovala iz mesečnika v tisk, so boji pričeli oženjati. Ko je bil Frank Kerže tajnik SNPJ, so ga v Glasu Svoboda na vse načine izživali, blatili mu očitali osmošolstvo in da tak ne bi smel biti tajnik avstrijske organizacije. Kerže pa bil značajan in držal se je geče, kdor molči, devetim odzori. Ker ni odgovarjal na nagibe, je to njegove nasprotnike jezilo. On je bil dober, v računih in v govori, vedno je pričel nove reforme in jih tudi nikoli ustavil. Kot gl. odzori, je mi je ugrabil in njegova zaslug je, da je IV. konvencija v Clevelandu proglasila glasilo za enakopravno. Zadevni predlog je postavil on in pridobil glasove, da ga je sprejela. vsako veselico, ki jo je društvo pripravilo. Ko je jednota pričela izdajati dnevnik Prosveta, je pustil Glas Naroda in postal redni čitatelj Prosvete. Ameriški družinski koledar je vsako leto kupil od mene in v stavkah in križah je rad pomagal vsakemu. Dasi sva se večkrat arditno spoprijela zaradi vere in socializma, se nisva vseeno nikdar podala in sva oba trdno vztrajala vsak na svojem stališču. Ob neki priliki mi je dal Kovač lepo priznanje, ko je izjavil, da me šteje med najboljše in najpoštenjše ljudi na Glencoe, čeprav ne verujem v Boga.

Lansko leto v oktobru je ta moj prijatelj umrl pri svojem starejšem sinu Jožetu v Laffertyju v starosti 76 let. Bil je član SNPJ do smrti, vendar ni bilo nobenega iz Laffertyja niti iz Glencoe, da bi mu privoščili par besed v Prosveti. Imena ustanoviteljev: John Marincič, Valentin Ti-

pan, Valentin Luznar, Jacob Tisol, William Rus, Frank Blazun, John Zevnik, John Bizjak, John Jekovec, Andrej Cankar in John Jekovec. Brat Jacob Tisol predlaga, naj se nakupijo vse potrebne knjige. Sprejeto. Brat John Marincič: naj se nabavi društveni pečat. Tudi sprejeto. Na seji se tudi izvoli enoletni stalni odbor sledečih bratov: John Marincic, predsednik, Valentin Tipan, podpredsednik, Valentin Luznar, tajnik (zapisnikar), William Rus, finančni tajnik, Jacob Tisol, blagajnik in zastopnik, John Zevnik, Frank Blazun, John Jekovec, bolniški odbor."

Razvoj društva št. 8

Društvo je dobilo svoj čarter 1. avgusta 1907. Imena na istemu so kakor sledi: Tisol Jack, Rus William, Marincic John, Svanik Joe, Smodic John, Stern Valentin, Sajevic John, Hvala Blasius, Aučin August in Lustig Rudolph. — (Dalje prihodnjič.)

The Reveliers' Column

Ambridge, Pa.—There's the subject cooperation. Some three years ago I promised I would harp on it quite a lot. I didn't—not often. So, you may be able to go through with this.

Roosevelt as Kerensky

Perhaps for the education of the American people it has been worth while to play the farce of the old dolt Dr. Wirt, Superintendent of Schools in Gary, Indiana (God save children!) and the credulous public! But whole affair is an affront to the intelligence nearly everybody involved in wasting millions of words on it. With desperate problems of human need in America our attention liberally diverted by politicians and businessmen to the wordy nothings of an old dabbler in matters he doesn't understand.

I comment on this folly here principally cause it is as good an occasion as any to a word of warning about the reckless use of historical parallels. Neither in person nor in action does Roosevelt resemble Kerensky. Whatever he has done or has not done the New Deal is in no sense the equivalent of the first Russian Revolution. Why this less desire to compare people to Kerensky to Stalin when the comparison isn't even 1 per cent suggestive?

What is more serious is the apparent willingness even of some believers in democracy to accept Kerensky as an exponent of democracy—witness Simeon Strunsky's recent book view in the New York Times. And Strunsky seems to be regarded by some of our Socialist comrades as an exponent of Socialist view of democracy! Now, as a matter of fact, in realistic sense of the word did Kerensky stand for democracy. One of his most dangerous errors was his insistence on keeping Russia a war which the people had overwhelmed and almost unanimously repudiated. This is a sin against democracy as well as against common sense, aided by pressure from the side—but that does little to mitigate Kerensky's guilt and it does nothing at all to justify him as an exponent of democracy. It is precisely this sort of loose thinking both by the critics and opponents of democracy, a loose thinking just now very manifest in discussions with the Socialist Party, which does so much cloud the issue.—Norman Thomas.

Roosevelt Stands Pat

It is becoming increasingly evident that Roosevelt administration is standing pat on present program, and gambling on a return of prosperity. There have been no important experiments undertaken at this session Congress, and what changes have been made have been largely in the conservative direction. The security market and stock exchange regulation bills are being modified, the industrialists are more thoroughly in control of the NRA, the company union has received the President's blessing, and the civil works program, the only feature of the new deal that directly benefited the masses, has been shelved.

Meanwhile the number of unemployed continues well above the 11,000,000 mark, the relief agencies are swarmed with more applicants than ever before. The increased cost of living has nullified what small monetary wage increases labor has obtained. Beyond question the industrialists and the bankers are better off than they were, but labor is learning that its emancipation can only come through its own organized economic and political strength.—J. J. S. in Labor Advocate.

Presidential Education

One lesson President Roosevelt will have learned by now is that the crowd he is trying to save hasn't sense enough to let itself be saved.

The lesson he still has to learn is that if it could be saved, it would be worse than letting it go to the devil.—American Guardian.

Our agitators must be capable of explaining the term "fraternalism" to those who lack the knowledge and are not yet members of our fraternal order. They must thoroughly understand that fraternalists are building a society on brotherly relations, social justice and equal rights for all. The establishment of these principles is so significant that a thorough comprehension of them will carry sufficient weight to induce people to prefer a fraternal organization to other types of insurance companies.
