Opsoval je demokracijo kot "kalužo boljševizma"

MOSKVA GA VABI, NAJ PRIDE PO ZEMLJO!

Moskva, 15. sept. — Sovjetski uradni listi danes vabijo Adolfa Hitlerja, diktatorja nazijske Nemčije, naj pride in si vzame Ukrajino, Urale in Sibirijo, katere si tako želi, če ima korajžje. "Skromne sanje Hitlerja so nam znane," pravijo listi, ki komentirajo njegov govor v Nurembergu in njegov vzklik, kako bi Nemčija plavala v bogastvu, če bi imela Ukrajino, Urale in Sibirijo. "Toda njegove želje so zaman. Vodenje države v Nurembergu imajo prav toliko priložnosti, da bi videli sovjetsko zemljo kakor videti lastna ušesa. Sovjeti so močni in pripravljeni in poskrbeli bodo za brzdno razočaranje tih, ki trpe na teh histeričnih manjah".

Nuremberg, Nemčija, 15. sept. — Hitler je izjavil sinoči, ko je nastopil zborovanje nazijske stranke v tem mestu, da v bodočnosti ne bo več imel nikakršnih stikov z voditelji komunistične Rusije. Obnovil je histeričen napad na sovjetje in opuljal je demokracijo v splošnem kot "kalužo boljševizma". Obenem je opozoril nacije, naj bodo pripravljene na večje žrtve kot so bile doslej, kajti Nemčija se mora dvigniti ekonomsko in postati mora neodvisna za vsako ceno — leprav mora biti cena nepopisno nivo trpljenja.

Hitler je čez dan uprizoril velike vojaške manevre v okolici Nuremberga, pri katerih je nastopilo 250,000 mož in 370 letal. Bitke v teh manevrih so bile med naciji in "boljševiki" in zadnji so bili tepteni na vsej črti...

Eksperiment s stradanjem propadel, toda ga ne bo še konec

EDINO "BERAČI" SO UPOSTEVANI

Trenton, N. J. — (FP) — Dr. šava New Jersey, dom marsikaterega multimilijonarja, veselo nadaljuje s svojim "stradalnim eksperimentom", s katerim počasi decimira brezposelne in njih družine. Listi skoraj dnevno poročajo kot nekaj povsem običajnega in naravnega, da je ta in ta umrla za — lakoto. Počasni smrti s stradanjem so zapisani tisoči in tisoči v tej bogati državi.

Kljub temu tragičnemu "eksperimentu", katerega s zanimanjem opazujejo vsi libertyligarji, se nikdo ne gane, da bi ga odpravil in nadomestil z običajnim sistemom državnega reliefa. Gubernor Hoffman, ki je potrošil milijon državnega denarja v znanem Hauptmannovem procesu, je sicer priznal, da je sistem lokalnega reliefa propadel, toda ne namerava storiti koraka, da mu napravi konec.

Prešlo pomlad so brezposelni skušali napraviti konec temu "eksperimentu". Več dni so bili s svojo "okupacijsko armado" popolen gospodar državne zbornice, toda poslancev in Hoffmannove administracije niso mogli prisliti na dovolitev denarja za relief. Legislatura je po več tednih prerekanja zaključila zasedanje in se razšla, ker ni marala naložiti davka na dohodek in s tem razjeziti kapitaliste. Eno stvarno je prepustila relief lokalnim vladam.

Ker lokalne vlade, občine in mesta, nimajo sredstev in ne volje v bogatejših občinah, je lokalni relief bolj po imenu kakor v resnici. Tedenski relief na družino znaša običajno od enega do poldrugega dolarja. In vsak, kdor ga hoče oziroma more dobiti, se mora prej javno proglasiti za berača. Šličen sistem je imela Anglija v dobi kraljice Elizabete pred več ko 300 leti!

Posledica tega je sistematično stradanje in faktično umiranje za lakoto. To brez ovinkov priznavajo razne raziskovalne agencije, ki se zanimajo za ta "eksperiment". Žrtve brezposelnosti, "klientje" namreč, dobe le nekoliko živčevja, ne dobe pa obleke in ne stanarine. Otroci ne dobe nobenega mleka, čeprav jih je med "klienti" 42%. Lokalni relief je v nekompetentnih rokah. Reče že najraje rinejo na — beračnje, za kar jim dajo dovoljenje.

"Prej moraš umreti, predno ti dajo kaj," je neka sestradana mati 13 otrok dejala preiskovalcu WPA. Neki 83-letni starček mu je potožil: "Danes sem komaj vstal s stola. Vem, da bom moral kmalu umreti. Če bi mi prišli nekaj dni pozneje, bi me več ne našli tukaj." Tudi za take rečeve nima bogata New Jersey skorjice kruha, ker je treba pač bogatim protektirati pred večjimi davki.

Tudi zvezna vlada se ne zani-ma za te rečeve, odkar je napravila "konec temu biznisu z reliefom". Če bi bila država New Jersey kje na jugu, bi bila mogoče še deležna kaj subvencij iz zvezne zakladnice. Toda Hoffmannova administracija je republikanska in naj torej ona nosi odgovornost za ta "eksperiment" (niti na 2. strani.)

Hitler še vedno za-laga Špance z letali

Levičarji zbili na tla italijansko letalo

Madrid, 15. sept. — Veliko italijansko bombno letalo Caproni-jevega modela je večeraj padlo na tla v okolici Talavere. Sestrelili so ga vladni letalci in u-jeli pilota, ki je bil lahko ranjen ter ga poslali v Madrid.

Iz Caceresa v južni Španiji poročajo, da so španski fašisti spet dobro založeni z najnovejšimi bombnimi aeroplani iz Nemčije in v omenjenem mestu so ustanovili svežo aviativno bazo za bombardiranje Madrida in drugih ljudskih postojank iz zraka. Poročevalec je videl tamkaj deset velikih nemških letal, ki jih pilotirajo Nemci v beli uniformi.

Iz San Sebastiana je prišla vest, da je fašistični general Emilio Mola poslal maroške čete, ki so mu pomagale zavzeti to pristaniščno mesto na severu, na jugozapad, kjer je glavni fašistični vođa, general Francisco Franco, pripravil desperatno ofenzivo v smeri proti Toledu in Madridu. Franco ni mogel mialiti na to ofenzivo, dokler ni prejel večjega števila letal iz Nemčije in Italije.

Madrid, 16. sept. — Španska vlada poroča, da je v Madridu zaslega svezih 14 milijonov dolarjev v španski gotovini, dobrih vrednostnih papirjih in zlatu. To bogastvo je bilo skrito v palačah aristokratov, monarhistov in drugih reakcionarjev, ki so pobegnili iz Španije še pred fašističnim vstajo. Samo v palači markija Sannicolasa Dennore je vlada našla skoro za 10 milijonov dolarjev zlata in drugih finančnih vrednot.

Vladna tajna policija je zadnje dni odkrila fašistično zaroto v Madridu zoper življenje predsednika Azane in premierja Caballera. Devet zarotnikov je bilo aretiranih.

Pariz, 16. sept. — Francoski poročevalci, ki so se vrnili iz Španije, poročajo o silnem belem terorju, s katerim so fašisti začeli na debelo v mestih in vaseh, ki so pod njihovo kontrolo. Aretacije in eksekucije oseb, ki so kolikaj na sumu, da simpatizirajo z vlado in republiko, so na dnevnem redu. Najbolj na sumu so delavci in revni kmetje in med temi je največ žrtev belega terora.

Richman se vrnil po zraku v Ameriko

Harbor Grace, Nova Fundlandija, 15. sept. — Harry Richman, ameriški letalec in newyorški gledališki igralec, in njegov pilot Richard Merrill, sta se večeraj vrnila po zraku iz Anglije, kamor sta poletela 2. septembra. Njun polet iz New Yorka na Anglesko je trajal 18 ur in 24 minut. Richman je upal, da pride v New York v 20 urah, moral je pa valed viharja pristati 1200 milj proč od New Yorka.

Policija protek-tira skebe

Oakland, Cal. — Skebje, ki delajo v tukajšnjih tekstilnih tovarnah, imajo vso policijsko protekcijo. Policija jih vozi na delo in z dela in tudi straži njihove domove. Stavkarjev še ni pričela metati v ječo, ker upa, da bodo kolikoli dovolj dobro sredstvo za zdrobitev stavke.

V Andaluziji so že poklali 47,000 nasprotnikov

JUNASKI BOJI DELAVSTVA

Na saragoški fronti, Španija. — (FP, poroča Pierre Van Paassen.) — V tem boju na življenje in smrt med svetovnim fašizmom in svobodo se špansko ljudstvo ovekovečuje s epičnim heroizmom, kakršnega ga ne pozna zgodovina. Če so na enem kraju poraženi po superiornih močeh mednarodnega fašizma, se na drugem kraju zaganjajo naprej z nadčloveško voljo. Pri tem jih ne ustavijo niti vsa grozodejstva reakcije, ki so ostudnejša kakor jih je kdaj poznal srednji vek.

Odkar so fašistični generali oddali prvi strel v domnevi, da bodo v kratkem času napravili konec demokratsko izvoljeni vladi, je preteklo še dva meseca. S to vero so se dvignili proti vladi, ker so imeli skoraj vsi armado na svoji strani. Namah je odpovedal tudi vladni administrativni aparat. Prvih 24 ur je res izgledalo, kakor je minister industrije in trgovine sam priznal, da bo armada generala Mola vkorakala v Madrid.

Tedaj so stopile v akcijo brez izjeme vse delavske organizacije in se ponudile vladi. Popolnoma nelzevžbana delavska milica se je takorekva z golimi pestmi vrgla proti perfektno trenirani armadi. Orožja ni bilo skoraj nič. Transportacija in komunikacije je odpovedala. Zaloge živčevja so pričele hitro padati. Kljub vsemu temu je pa delavstvo stopilo v akcijo z disciplino, ki bo ostala predmet obudovanja še dolga leta, in vrglo nazaj eno fašistično ofenzivo za drugo.

Vsaka priporjena ura je bila velikega pomena za vlado. Medtem, ko so delavski bataljoni držali sovražnika nazaj, so se tisoči in tisoči vrgli na organiziranje vojne industrije. Kar je bila pred šestimi tedni kaotična drhal, je danes perfektno disciplinirana armada. Vojne potrebe se izlivajo v vedno večjem toku iz tovarn. Kolikor se orožja tiče, se bo delavska milica lahko v prihodnjih par tednih kosala s fašistično armado, katere je imela v tem oziru velike prednosti.

Ako bodo vlade striktno izvajale neintervencijsko pogodbo, bo španska republika izšla iz tega boja zmagovito. In to kljub 400 bombnim aeroplanom, s katerimi sta Hitler in Mussolini založila španske fašiste. Ta zmaga seveda še ni na vidiku. Franco in Mola ne bosta odložila orožja, dokler ne bosta dosegla Madrida. Ako ne bosta mogoča doseči svojega cilja, po sedanjih taktiki počasnega pritiska, tedaj se bosta skoraj gotovo zatekla k strupenemu pljusu, katerega imata velike zalogo. V Burgosu in Valladolidu ga leži 20,000 nabojev, katerega je španski fašizem poslal Hitler skozi Portugalsko.

Dvomljivo je, da bo Franco skušal poslati svojo armado iz Seville proti Madridu. On namreč prav dobro ve, da bi se vsa provinca Andaluzija takoj dvignila proti njemu za njegovim (Datje na 3. strani.)

Brezposelnostno zavarovanje

Z njim se bodo bavile legislature v 14 državah

Washington. — Vprašanje zavarovanja proti brezposelnosti bo prihodnje leto na legislativnem programu najmanj 14 držav, pravi zvezna komisija za socialno zaščito. Države, ki že imajo komisije za študiranje tega problema, so Connecticut, Kentucky, Michigan, New Jersey, North Carolina, Texas, West Virginia in Colorado.

Pričakuje se, da bodo državne delavske federacije prišle pred legislature s svojimi lastnimi osnutki in v Tennesseeju, Arkansasu, Pennsylvaniji, Ohiju, Marylandu in Minnesoti.

Te ali druge vrste brezposelnostno zavarovanje so v zadnjih dveh letih sprejele države Alabama, California, Indiana, Massachusetts, Mississippi, New Hampshire, New York, Oregon, Rhode Island, South Carolina, Washington, Wisconsin in District of Columbia. Zakone vseh teh držav je že odobrila zaščitna komisija, na odobritev pa še čakajo države Idaho, Louisiana in Utah.

Wisconsin je prva država, ki je sprejela tak zakon, po katerem je pričela plačevati podporo prošli mesec.

Zaščitna komisija pravi, da ti zakoni krijejo okrog 46 odstotkov vseh industrijskih delavcev in delic. Zakoni so različni od države do države. Podpora je povsod zelo omejena in traja okrog 15 tednov na leto.

V smislu zveznega zaščitnega zakona, ki stoji v veljavo s 1. januarjem 1937 po vsej državi, osem ali več delavcev. Države, ki sprejmejo brezposelnostno zavarovanje, dobe 90% svojih prispevkov nazaj za financiranje zavarovanja. Ostalih deset odstotkov bo šlo za administracijske stroške.

S prihodnjim januarjem stopi v veljavo tudi zakon za zvezno starostno zavarovanje, v kateri sklad bodo prispevali delavci in delodajalci. Zakon pa je tak, da bo vzel najmanj eno generacijo predno bo pričel funkcionirati v polnem zamahu kolikor se zavarovancev tiče. Mnogi so mnenja, da bo vrhovno sodišče vrglo vse skupaj akoli okno, brezposelnostno in starostno zavarovanje. Do preizkušnje tega zakona bo gotovo prišlo prihodnje leto.

Zgodovina republikanske stranke

V začetku politične zgodovine Združenih držav je bila stranka, ki je zastopala osnovna načela, identificirana danes z republikansko stranko, znana pod imenom "federalistična stranka". Glavna načela, ki so jih zastopali, so bila: 1) fundiranje narodnega dolga; 2) prevzete državni dolgov, napravljenih tekom revolucije; 3) zaščitne carine; 4) zdrava narodna valuta; 5) podpiranje ameriških prevoznih ladij; 6) primerna vojna obramba. Hamilton je polagal večjo važnost na trgovino in industrijo kot na poljedelstvo.

Zares, če le nekoliko poznamo najnovejšega španskega zgodovino socialnih razmer, tedaj ta delavec vseh drugih dežel jasno pove, da morajo spoznati soglasnost nacionalistov vseh narodnosti proti delavstvu, obenem pa, da se španski junaki, da se kmetje in delavci ter malomeščani Španije bore za nas vse! — D. P.

Zgodovina republikanske stranke

V začetku politične zgodovine Združenih držav je bila stranka, ki je zastopala osnovna načela, identificirana danes z republikansko stranko, znana pod imenom "federalistična stranka". Čudno je, da nasprotna stranka, ki je bila predhodnica današnje demokratske stranke, se je tedaj nazivala "republikanska". Federalisti so kasneje prevzeli ime "Whigs" in ravno pred začetkom civilne vojne so prevzeli ime "republikanci". Ze tedaj se je stara republikanska stranka nazivala "demokratska stranka".

Po navadi delimo ameriško politično zgodovino v tri dobe. V prvi dobi imamo politično borbo med federalisti in republikanci (1789-1816), v drugi dobi med Whigs in demokrati (1830-1856) in v tretji dobi med republikanci in demokrati (od l. 1856 do današnjega dne).

Po sprejemu federalne ustave je Alexander Hamilton zastopal nekatera gospodarska načela, ki so v toku časa razdelila deželo v dve močnici nasprotujoči si skupini. Njegovi pristaši so kmalu postali znani pod imenom "federalisti". Glavna načela, ki so jih zastopali, so bila: 1) fundiranje narodnega dolga; 2) prevzete državni dolgov, napravljenih tekom revolucije; 3) zaščitne carine; 4) zdrava narodna valuta; 5) podpiranje ameriških prevoznih ladij; 6) primerna vojna obramba. Hamilton je polagal večjo važnost na trgovino in industrijo kot na poljedelstvo.

Ta načela so se dotikala gospodarskih interesov vseh skupin in distribucije narodnega bogastva kakor tudi cen vseh potrebščin. Pomenjala so, kaka gospodarska skupina naj prevladuje v javnem življenju. Udeleževanje teh načel je moralo dovajati do odločne industrializacije dežele ob koncentraciji bogastva in bankarstva, do ustanovitve velikopoteznih industrij. Naravno je, da so ta načela vzbujala nasprotstvo in so morala izživati ustvarjanje druge močnice politične stranke.

V teku let do 1800 je federalistična stranka polagoma izgubila svoj vpliv vsled nekaterih jako nepopularnih mer, in l. 1800 je bil izvoljen za predsednika Thomas Jefferson nad kandidatom federalistom. Od tedaj 28 let smo imeli predsednike, ki so se nazivali "republikanci", pri čemer ne smemo pozabiti, da ti "republikanci" so bili pravzaprav "demokrati" v kasnejši rabi tega političnega naslova. V kongresu je prevladovala ista stranka. Federalistična stranka je sicer postavljala svoje kandidate do l. 1816, dokler se ni končno razpustila.

Takoj pred l. 1831 so se nasprotniki vladajoče republikansko-demokratske stranke zopet organizirali pod imenom "nacionalni republikanci" in postavili so Henry Claya za svojega predsedniškega kandidata. Ni so uspeli, ali l. 1834 so se združili z drugimi elementi in si prideli naslov "Whigs", katero ime je bilo prevzeto iz angleške politične zgodovine, kjer se je politična borba vodila med "Tories" (konservativci) in "Whigs" (liberalci). Ta "Whig" stranka v Združenih državah je nominalno obstojala do l. 1856 in je dvakrat uspela izvoliti svojega predsedniškega kandidata: William Henry Harrison l. 1840 in general Taylor l. 1848. V glavnem se lahko reče, da so Whigs zastopali ista fundamentalna načela kot bivši federalisti, daai valed hitrega razvoja Zapada in Juga je dežela postala pretežno poljedelarska in so zato "Whigs" postopali jako previdno pri zastopanju svojih osnovnih načel.

L. 1856 je kapital, investiran v tovarnah, železnicah, rudnikih in mestnih podjetjih, že nadkriljeval vrednost vseh poljedelskih investicij med Atlantikom in Pacifikom. K starim političnim načelom, podedovanim od Hamiltona, se je bilo pridružilo preče vprašanje suženjstva. Obe stranki, Whigs in demokrati, sta bili v razslu širok Severa in Vzhoda. Cas je bil zrel za nove politične grupacije. Tedaj se je ustanovila nova (tretja) republikanska stranka, ki je imela svojo prvo narodno konvencijo v Philadelphiji l. 1856 z odločno protisuženjsko platformo. L. 1860 je bil Abraham Lincoln izvoljen kot njen prvi predsednik. To je bil začetek sedanje republikanske stranke.

Od civilne vojne naprej je republikanska stranka kontrolirala ameriško vlado. V zadnjih desetletjih je gospodarski napredek Združenih držav dosegel popolno preobrat gospodarskega življenja. Razvile so se orjaške korporacije. Carine so bile višje in višje in tedaj je demokratska stranka začela svoj napad proti velekapitalu. Agrarni interesi so se začeli pojavljati na Zapadu v nasprotstvu proti velebiznisu.

Ze l. 1901 se je začela pojavljati razpoka v republikanski stranki, ko je Theodore Roosevelt zagovarjal nekatera načela naprednih agrarnih elementov. Končno je l. 1912 prišlo do popolne razcepitve v republikanski stranki, ko je Roosevelt ustanovil svojo "progressivno" stranko. Posledica je bila, da je po dolgih letih zopet zmagal demokrat (Woodrow Wilson).

Po vojni so republikanci zopet prišli do oblasti pri volitvah l. 1920. V dvanajstih letih republikanske uprave se je polagala največja važnost na razvoj industrialnega življenja kot glavni vir ameriške prosperitete.

Letoanja platforma republikanske stranke radikalno ne spreminja osnovnih načel, ki so vedno vodila to stranko, začenši od nekdanjih federalistov.

Zgodovina demokratske
stranke

Demokratska stranka, kot jo danes poznamo
je bila prvič organizirana od onih, ki so kriti-
rali prvotno federalistično stranko, katera je
bila prva politična skupina, ki je prišla do vla-
de sestavi in sprejemu naše konstitucije l. 1787.
Te kritike so nazivali "antifederaliste", kma-
pa so se stopili v redno stranko, ki je prevze-
ime "republikanska." Za časa tretjih predse-
dnih volitev je bila dežela že jasno razdeljena
v federaliste in republikance. Pri tem naj
pozabimo, da ti "republikanci" nimajo ničesa
opraviči s današnjimi republikanci; narobe,
so bili predhodniki današnjih demokratov. Je-
ferson, vodja republikancev, je bil napadan ko
ateist in demagog, dočim federalistični kandid-
Adama je bil psovan od nasprotnikov kot "be-
narhist". Že tedaj je bila borba med obeh
strankama tako tesno začrtana, da je bil Adam
izvoljen samo s tremi elektoralnimi glasovi v
čine.

L. 1800 je pa republikanska stranka (pazi
zopet na protislovje v istoimnosti) zmagala.
Jefferson je bil izvoljen za predsednika z znat-
večino. Nadaljnjih 28 let (od 1801 do 1829)
bili v Beli hiši predsedniki, ki so se nazivali re-
publikanci. In v tej dobi so se konsolidirala
čela sedanje demokratske stranke. Jefferson
sam poljedelski veleposestnik, je imel intere-
poljedelstva pri srcu. On je veroval in javi-
trdjal, da so poljedelci najbolj pomembni drža-
ljani. Na drugi strani je omalovaževal trgov-
no in industrijo, ustvarjajočo mestni prolet-
ariat. S takim naziranjem se je boril proti ka-
pitalističnim tendencam Hamiltona in federal-
istične stranke.

Druge logične posledice Jeffersonovih na-
so bile niska carina in "strogo tolmachenje" ko-
stitucije, t. j. oblasti federalne vlade je tre-
tolmačiti z omejevalnega stališča, oblasti drža-
pa z liberalnega. Na tak način je nastala be-
ba o "pravem pomenu" konstitucije in "pra-
cah držav", katera vprašanja igrajo tako v
liko vlogov v ameriški politični zgodovini. Ko
Jeffersonovi pristaši se večinoma niso pečali
trgovino ali industrijo, so visoke carine pom-
njale zanje le draginjo brez vsake protutež-
koristi. Največja mogoča mera državne av-
nomije jim je zagotavljala gospodarsko in p-
ritično neodvisnost, brez vsakega pritiska s str-
ni federalne vlade, ki je bila do l. 1800 v roki
zagovornikov gospodarskih načel, ugodnih za
dustriale.

V teku dolgih let republikanske nadvlade
se razvile nekatere osnovne gospodarske spr-
membe, ki so ojačale levo krilo te stranke. Ra-
voj Zapada z njegovimi korenjaškimi pionir-
brez vsake zavednosti socialne razlike in rasto-
pomen bombaža na Jugu sta dodajala še več si
Jeffersonovim pristašem. Finančni in indu-
trialni interesi na vzhodu in srednjih vzhodnih
državah pa so že bili v boju z razvijajočim
delavskim gibanjem na eni strani, z zapadni-
poljedelcem in s lastnikom suženjev na Jugu
drugi strani. L. 1828 se je pojavil zastavono-
vseh teh treh elementov Andrew Jackson in
teku njegovih dveh administracij so republi-
kanci polagoma opustili staro ime in prevze-
ime "demokrati."

Od l. 1828 do 1860 so demokrati zmagali
vseh predsedniških volitvah razen dvakrat.
1850 so se pa že pojavili znaki oslavljanja nj-
hovega političnega položaja. Tedaj je vre-
nost imovine, investirane v tovarnah, rudniki
in železnicah, že nadkrillila vrednost poljed-
ske lastnine. Industrialna mesta so urno rasi.
Ekonomske sistem Severovzhoda se je bil ra-
širil na Severozapad in ves pretežno industri-
ski Sever je stal nasproti veleposestnikom
Jugu. Vprašanje suženjstva je postalo pereč.
Demokratje so propadli l. 1860 in nova republi-
kanska stranka, zastopajoča osnovna načela n-
kdanje federalistične stranke, je prišla na čel.
Čudežni industrialni razvoj je bil republikan-
cem v korist.

Med l. 1860 in 1912 so demokrati uspeli le
p dvojih predsedniških volitvah: Grover Cleve-
land je bil izvoljen l. 1884 in po štiriletnem
prstanju zopet l. 1893. Polagoma se je pa raz-
vijala levčarska agrarna struja, ki je končno
1896 nadvladala demokratsko stranko in raz-
cepila republikance na dvoje. Ta struja je žla-
sti zahtevala večjo količino denarja v cirkula-
ciji in nizko carino. S temi in drugimi načeli
je kandidat demokratske stranke Bryan dva
krat apeliral na deželo, l. 1896 in zopet l. 1900.

Vprašanje kruha

Stara resnica je že, da človek je to, kar poje
in pije. Od nature dobi ali na svet prinesel
želodec in druge telesne organe, ali ti organi so
kmalu mrtvi, če redno ne dobivajo pravilne
hrane.

Samo ob sebi se torej razume — naradni in-
stinkt to pove slehernemu bitju — da je kruh
prvi pogoj obstanka življenja. Kruh je prvi in
potem šele filozofija o življenju. Če mož-
gani, v katerih se vrši proces mišljenja in filo-
zofiranja, ne dobe iz želodca potrebnih snovi,
proces kmalu odpove službo in izpuhti v nič.

Kruh imamo za splošen pojem prehrane.
Vprašanje kruha je torej vprašanje redne in
pravilne prehranitve vsakega posameznika.
Vsakdo mora imeti hrano, če hoče živeti; vsa-
kdo mora imeti dovolj dobre hrane, če hoče
biti zdrav in sposoben za delo in svoje naloge v
življenju.

Žival se hrani instinktivno, po narurnem na-
gonu. Isto dela divji in barbarski človek, ki
stoji je eno stopnjo ali dve nad živaljo. To po-
meni, da instinkt ali nagon pove bitju, katera
hrana je zanj dobra in katera ni.

Civiliziranemu človeku pa ne zadostuje sam
nagon. Civilizirani človek je spoznal, da zanj
ni vse dobro, kar je dobro za žival ali divjaka.
Zanj je potreben nov sistem prehranjevanja, ki
temelji na znanosti. Primitivna, groba prehra-
na, odvisna od kapric nature in naključja, mora
kmalu potegniti civilizirane ljudi nazaj v bar-
barstvo in divjaštvo.

Civilizirani človek je živež znanstveno anali-
ziral in ve, kakšne hrane mu je treba za močne
živece in možgane, za mišice in kosti in za ostale
dele telesa. Skratka: prehranjevanje se je raz-
vilo v znanost oziroma se še razvija v znanost
— in prej ali slej mora biti ta znanost prva in
poglavitna v človeški družbi.

Da je prehrana ljudi še tako revno urejena
in še vedno pri ogromni večini človeštva silno
primitivna ter pomanjkljiva, je krivo to, ker
miselnih razvoj človeštva v splošnem zaostaja za
materialnim razvojem. Materialno človek že
stoji visoko v industrijski civilizaciji, ampak po
idejah je še vedno barbar, če gledamo na sploš-
nost. Ta strašna razdvojenost je tudi kriva, da
vprašanje kruha — ekonomsko in socialno vpra-
šanje — še danes ni rešeno.

To je tudi krivo, da je živež — najvažnejša in
najdragocenejša potreba človeka — še danes
predmet kupčije, blago, ki se ne
proizvaja direktno zato, da ga vsakdo uživa,
temveč v prvi vrsti zato, da se prodaja v svrhu
privatnega dobička. Predno si nabaviš svoj po-
trebni kosček kruha, se mora nekdo drugi oko-
ristiti s tem kosčkom!

Dobava živil je še vedno prepuščena posebnim
slojem: farmerjem, živinorejcem, mesar-
jem in dolgi vrsti trgovcev. Od farmerja na
zapadu do restavracije kje v New Yorku je
dolga pot in na tej poti je najmanj tisoč ljudi,
ki se okoriščajo od obroka jedi, katero si na-
ročila v restavraciji. In kakšna je ta jed? Na-
vadno slaba in stokrat skvarjena, tako da ima
v sebi več nesnage in bolezenskih bacilov kakor
potrebne redilnosti!

Dobra hrana je najboljša preventivna medi-
cina za zdravje človeka, toda koliko dobre, ne-
pokvarjene in zdrave hrane moreš dobiti v
ogromni večini neštetih lukenj, ki se imenujejo
pekarije, mesnice, grocerijske prodajnice, de-
likatesne prodajnice in restavracije v ameri-
ških mestih? Zelo, zelo malo! Revez mora še
biti kos učenjaka, da zna izbirati med slabim
in dobrim živcem in še izhaja z bornim za-
služkom.

In trgovci z živili so prav tako žrtve izkori-
ščevalskega sistema kakor so njihovi odjemal-
ci. Če hočejo eksistirati, morajo narediti do-
biček, morajo prodajati najslabše blago po ode-
ruskih cenah. Na snago in sanitarnost se ne
smejo ozirati!

Vprašanje kruha torej ni samo vprašanje
dobre plače, temveč je tudi revolucionarno vpra-
šanje izpremembe gospodarskega reda. Dobre
hrane za vse ljudi ne bo toliko časa, dokler ne
bo znanstveno proizvajana in strogo kontrolir-
rana po strokovnjakih — dokler ne bo živilom
odvzet motiv provalnega profita.

From these 14 members, Anne Podergals, Ann Povsha, Louis Kualjan, Agnes Tanko, Rudolph Slak, Rudolph Terasher, Joseph Oblak, Ludwig Oblak, Frank Perko Jr., Anton Tanko, Joseph Radelj, Mary Podergals, Louise Podergals and Joseph Povsha grew the third ranking English Speaking lodge in the SNPJ.

On June 25, 1926, the second meeting was held and the first permanent officers were elected: Joe Radelj, president; Louis Kualjan, vice president; Frank Perko Jr., secretary; Ludwig Oblak, recording secretary. Financial contributions and moral support was extended by the senior lodges. To Albert Hrast and Frank Perko Sr. we owe much of our success of the past decade. Both gave freely of their time and efforts and made our path a much easier one during those trying times.

Being the Badger state's 1st English Speaking lodge and as our state has always been a leader in progressive thought, the name "Badgers" was adopted. At this time (August, 1926) our charter was received.

A Letter From Slovenia
 Poljane, Jugoslavia, July 6, 1936, 10:10 p. m. (5:10 p. m. Pittsburgh time).
 Draga Paula!—
 We just had supper at your grandmother's place and there not being anything else to do, Johnny and I are sitting here chatting with your grandma, your aunt, my mother, your mother, and a little crippled girl. She is your cousin. Grandma is sitting quietly on the couch, as pert as you please. Her tanned face is wreathed in smiles as she looks adoringly at her youngest grandson who had just popped in to surprise her. You can easily picture her joy when Johnny walked into the door and announced himself. "Jaz sem mlajši sin tvojeja Pavleta." The resemblance between her and Johnny is perfect. Your uncle just walked in and is sitting on the clay bench which is part of and surrounds the ancient oven. And now another cousin stepped in, a pretty girl about sixteen years old.
 I wish I could take down in shorthand what they are talking about. Your mother is asking grandma about your father's youth and she is now telling her about it—how your father carried a "koš" filled with manure, on his back, up these mountains—how he scraped and saved his pennies so that he could come to America.
 There is no use in trying to tell you in letter form what we have seen and done here in Europe. It would take a volume to do the trip justice. I will just briefly tell you of some of our observations and most outstanding sensations. You will please pardon the use of adjectives. The task requires them to profusion.
 The most pronounced, the most striking thing here in the Balkans, especially in Jugoslavia, is the appalling, God-defying poverty of our people. I have ever been proud of my heritage. Even in America I boasted always to my colleagues and friends that I was of Slovene birth. I am utterly incapable of telling you now how I felt when I arrived at the border of Jugoslavia on the summit of that tremendous mountain range that separates our country from Austria, on that rainswept ridge high above the clouds.
