Tito bo dobil pšenico

Novi grobovi

Vlada Združenih držav je obvestila FLR Jugoslavijo, da je pripravljena začeti razgovore za dobavo ameriške pšenice Jugoslaviji.

BEOGRAD, FLRJ. — Po dajšem omahovanju so se Združene države odločile "prodati" Jugoslaviji novega pol milijona ton pšenice za dinarje. To odločitev so sporočili včeraj tukajšnji vladni. Združene države zatrjujejo, da zavlačevanje odločitve o prodaji pšenice ni imelo nobene zvezes s "preoceno" ameriške politike do takozvanih nevtralnih držav. Ta preocena še ni končana in nemara še ne bo nekaj mesecev.

Podpiranje rdeče Jugoslavije je ameriško javnost precej razburilo, prav posebno dojava jet letal. Ostre glasovne kritike je bilo sišati v Kongresu kot tudi v časopisu. Na odločitev vlade to za sedaj ni imelo bistvenega vpliva. Jugoslavija zatrjuje, da je imela letos skrajno slabo leto in da potrebuje ameriško pšenico, da bo mogla svoje prebivalstvo dostojno prehraniti.

Tito se je še nedavno pritoževal, da Združene države zadružujejo pomoč Jugoslaviji, da bi jo prisilile k spremembam njene zunanjosti politike. V istem govoru je ponovno jasno pokazal, da stoji v mednarodni politiki popolnoma na sovjetski strani.

Eichmannov proces bodo nadaljevali 11. dec.

TEL AVIV, Izrael. — Izraelsko sodišče je sklenilo, da bo nadaljevalo znani Eichmannov proces 11. decembra. Takrat bo sodišče izjavilo, ali smatra Eichmannova sploh krivim za očitane zločine. Utemeljitev izjave bo zelo obširna; brali jo bodo par dni.

Ako bo Eichmann spoznan predlagal kazen, Eichmann in njegov avokat bosta seveda nasprotovala predlagani kazni. Takrat bo Eichmann najbrže imel zadnjic priliko, da se brani pred sodiščem. Upaj, da bo proces končan še tekom tega leta.


NATO reorganizira skandinavsko fronto

OSLO, Nor. — NATO zastopniki iz Zapadne Nemčije, Danske in Anglije so skupaj z Norvežani napravili načrt za reorganizacijo severne fronte NATO, ki se razteza od južne Danske do severne norveške meje. Sporazum je dejansko že dosežen, toda sklepni še niso uradno objavljeni. Sporazum obsegata reorganizacijo poveljstva fronte in izbor posameznih povojnikov.

Kot se vidi, se krogi NATO niso ozirali na Hruščeva, ki je porabil ravno njihove načrte za pritisne na Finsko. Pač pa je Norveška poslala svojega zunanjega ministra dr. Langa v Moskvo z nalogom, naj skuša prepričati Hruščeva, da severna fronta NATO nima nobenega napadalnega namena in da se mu radi tega ni treba znašati nad Finsko.

HOLANDIA, Nova Gv. — Čeprav doslej še niso našli nobene sledi za Rockefellerjevin sinom Michaelom, obstaja še vedno verjetnost, da ga bodo našli živega. Nelson Rockefeller, newyorski guverner, se osebno udeležuje reševalnih akcij.

Ceylon previden

Gledav bodočnost, ko se Amerika in Rusija lahko sporazumeta in skupno vladata svetu.

ZDRAŽENI NARODI, N. Y. — V političnem odboru glavne skupščine ZN je zastopnik Ceylona zahteval, da dobe "manjše sile," med katere spada po njegovem 97 od 103 članic ZN, enak glas v bodočih razgovorih o razorožitvi. Svoje tovariše je opozoril, da se obe glavni sili sveta, če ne najdeta sprejemljive rešitve, lahko nekega dne dogovorita, kako bosta skupno vladali svet in ustvarile nov "Pax Romana."

Zastopnik Ceylona Malalasekera je zatrjeval, da so se v preteklosti take stvari že dogajale in v načelu ne bi bilo nič čudnega, če do njih zopet pride. Po njegovem je to mogoče preprečiti le, če se "manjše sile" zavzamejo za pravico do enakega glasu v vprašanju razorožitve in delajo odločno na to, da pride med glavnimi silami sveda v tem vprašanju do sporazuma.

Norvežan ni molčal!

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Norveški zunanj minister, ki je prišel sem na uradni obisk, je ostrovavnil sovjetske očitke na račun svoje države v pogledu nemške nevarnosti.

Halvard Lange je na južni v norveškem poslanstvu, ki sta se jo udeležila podpredsednik sovjetske vlade Mikojan in njen zunanj minister Gromiko ostro zavrnili Mikojana, ko je očital Norveški, da samo "sedi in čaka," namesto da bi kaj storila za sklenitev mirovne pogodbe z Nemčijo.

Lange je dejal, da takega ruskega gledanja "ne more sprejeti" in je nato odločno zagovarjal NATO in norveško članstvo v njem.

Varnostni svet ZN pred kočljivimi nalogami

ZDRAŽENI NARODI, N. Y. — Na dnevnem redu Varnostnega sveta ZN je obravnavanje krize v Kongu. Tam je dejansko centralna javna uprava splahnela v nič. Kar še pomeni, je samo v prestolici Leopoldiville, zunaj prestolice je njen oblast le na papirju. Dokaz za tako stanje je nudil na zadnji seji Varnostnega sveta sam kongoški zunanj minister Bomboko, ko je predlagal, nanj ZN prevzamejo reorganizacijo in vežbanje kongoške armade. S tem je samo uradno priznal, da ta armada ali sploh ne obstaja več ali pa, če še kaj obstaja cd nje, ne uboga centralne vlade predsednika Adule.

Tako stanje odgovarja moskovskim načrtom, ki so si postavili že od začetka za cilj, da spremenijo Kongo v politične džunglo. Le v džungli je lahko začagnati državljansko vojno in se polasti oblasti. Zato je sovjetski delegat Zorin takoj nasprotoval želji kongoškega zunanjega ministra, češ da bi v tem slučaju bila organizacija ZN vezana na Kongo celo generacijo, morda pa še dalj časa. V tem pogledu ima Mo-

skovskemu delegatu Zorinu je torej jasno začrtana skriva čisto drug namen, kar se vidi iz moskovske želje, da naj centralna vlada preganja samo Čcombeja v Katangi, ne pa Gizengo v provinci Oriente.

Naša delegacija je namreč predlagala nekaj dodatkov k resoluciji, ki naj jo sklene Varnostni svet, in v enem dodatku je izrazeno navodilo za generalnega tajnika U Thanta, naj se skuša pobediti tako z Gizengom kot s Čcombejem na mirem način, ako bi se pokazalo, da je taka pot izvedljiva. Moskva je odločno proti. Trdi, da je Čcombeja treba pregnati s silo, da pa se Gizengi ne sme zgoditi ničesar.

Komunistično stališče je torej jasno: treba je podpirati kaos v Kongu, kajt kaos je najboljše orožje v rokah moskovskega prijatelja Gizenga, da počasi spodrine z oblasti centralno vlado in se sam pojavi kot centralna vlada. Kakor hitro bi to dosegel, bi seveda takoj šel na Čcombeja, da ustvari kongoško narodno in državno "edinost."

WASHINGTON IN BONN SE SPORAZUMELA O BERLINU

Predsednik Združenih držav Kennedy in zahodnovenški kancler Adenauer sta se tekom treh dni razgovorov v Washingtonu sporazumela o načrtu za reševanje berlinske krize. — Pariz še zmeraj proti pogajanju s Sovjetsko zvezo o Berlinu.

WASHINGTON, D. C. — Kennedy in Adenauer sta v sredo končala razgovore, ki sta jih začela v pondeljek. Prišla sta do sporazuma, da bosta zaveznikom priporočila razgovore s Sovjetsko zvezo o berlinskem vprašanju, če bo pokazala dobro voljo in pripravljenost k sporazumu. Ameriškemu poslaniku v Moskvi Thompsonu bo poslano navodilo za nove razgovore s predstavniki Sovjetske zveze vendar šele potem, ko se bodo zahodne sile pomenile o vseh perečih vprašanjih same med seboj. To je posebno važno zaradi tega, ker De Gaulle še vedno odklanja vsake razgovore o Berlinu, dokler Sovjetska zveza ne spremeni svojega stališča. V diplomatskih krogih sodijo, da do novih razgovorov med zahodnimi silami in Sovjetsko zvezo o Berlinu ne bo prišlo pred januarjem ali morda celo pred februarjem.

Zaključno poročilo o razgovorih med Kennedyem in Adenauerm sta objavila skupno predsednik tiskovni tajnik Salinger in tiskovni tajnik nemškega De Gaulle na obisk v Vel. Britanijo. Predsednik vlade Macmillan bo skusal uporabiti vso edina v temeljih, ki dovoljujejo svojo zgovornost in razloge, da mirno rešitev te krize potom bo De Gaulle pridobil za "pogajanji, če obstoji na strani skupne" razgovore s Sovjetom, Sovjetske zveze razumevanje."

Najprej novi razgovori Zahoda

Predno bo prišlo do novih neposrednih stikov med predstavniki zahodnih sil in Sovjetske zveze, se bo vršila vrsta razgovorov med zahodnimi silami samicami. Med njimi je še vedno v pogledu obravnavanja berlinskogovorov s Sovjetsko zvezo.

Končni cilj še vedno — zdržitev Nemčije

Zaključno poročilo o razgovorih Kennedy-Adenauer poudarja, da sta predsednik ZDA in nemški kancler potrdila znova, da je "končni cilj politike obeh vlad doseči zdržujoči Nemčijo." Vprašanje oborožitve NATO sil z atomskim orožjem je bilo odloženo in prepričeno razviti na posvetih NATO v Parizu prihodnjem mesecu. Poročilo poudarja, da mora to orožje po obstoječih zakonih ZD ostati do njih sprememb pod nadzorstvom predsednika ZDA.

Kennedy in Adenauer sta se izjavila za razna gibanja in potrebe, ki vodijo k zdrževanju Evrope, za Skupni trg, za Jeklarsko-premogovno skupnost EURATOM in za nov pokret politične zdržujočih svobodnega dela Evrope.

V posebnih razgovorih z vodnikami ameriške narodne obrambe je nemški obrambni minister Josef Strauss dejal, da je Nemčija pripravljena kupiti, oziroma naročiti v ZDA za novih 300 milijonov dolarjev orožja za svoje oborožene sile. To bo pomagalo Združenim državam zmanjšati odtok dolarjev (zlatih) iz dežele, ki je v zadnjih mesecih zopet porastel.

Castro je imel že dolgo časa posebno tajno radio postajo, ki je Dominikancem razlagala Castrovo in komunistične ideje, kako je tam treba vpletati "ljudsko demokracijo." Dogodki v Ciudad Trujillo so Castra prehiteli. Ameriško vojno brodovje je bilo preje v bližini dominikanske obale kot Castrovi čolnički. Dominikanški "fidelisti" in njihovi komunistični sponzorji so zamudili priliko, da se mešajo v potek dogodkov v dominikanski prestolici. Zato tako velika jeza v kubanskem prestolici Havani.

Vsaka jeza išče svoj ventil, da more izbruhniti. Castro je našel ventil v akciji pred Varnostnim svetom, kjer bo seveda do onemogočiti trobental o ameriškem imperializmu. Kar bo pri tem zanimalo, ne bo odmev v zidovih palace ZN, ampak v prestolcih v Latinski Ameriki. Tam je namreč v nekaterih mestih še zmeraj nekaj levicarjev, ki obsojajo ameriško politiko do Dominikanske republike. Grmenje v ZN jim bo prišlo prav za njihovo godnjanje v domači politiki.



"Toys for Tots" To Kick Off Nov. 24th

The "Toys for Tots" campaign of the Cleveland Marine Corps Reservists, the Community Christmas Committee of the Welfare Federation; the Volunteers of America; the Kiwanis Club of Greater Cleveland and the Shell Oil Company will begin Friday, November 24th and continue through December 14th, it was announced today by Major Robert F. De Meter, Commanding Officer of the 11th Infantry Battalion, US-MCR.

The purpose of the annual campaign, the 10th conducted by Marine Reservists here, is to make sure Christmas gifts of toys will be provided 27,000 less fortunate children in the Cleveland Area, whose parents are on relief.

Major De Meter said donations of new toys or toys in good condition are urgently needed. He said contributions of toys could be made by taking the toys to the nearest Shell Service Station and drop them in barrels provided by the stations.

He pointed out that Retail and Wholesale stores wishing to donate large amounts of toys could arrange for a store pick-up by calling the Marine Corps Reserve Training Center, SU 1-5541.

Major De Meter urged all school, church and civic groups to organize toy drives among their memberships, adding that the Marines would be glad to pick up these donations at any time.

All toys collected in the Cleveland Area will be distributed here, Major De Meter said. "Although Toys for Tots is nationwide Christmas project of the Marine Corps Reserve, each campaign is purely a local project." He said that the Kiwanis Clubs of Cleveland will collect toys at meetings, help provide publicity, and place posters in downtown business windows, plus aiding in the distribution of toys.

Distribution of toys will be made through the Community Christmas Committee of the Welfare Federation and the Volunteers of America. The Welfare Federation and the Volunteers of America will issue certificates to the needy families. Distribution of toys in return for the certificates will be made at the Marine Corps Reserve Training Center by the Marines, Kiwanis and the Shell Oil Company on December 16 and 17.

The Shell Oil Company will make their Service Stations available as collection centers.

Cleveland's 11th Infantry Battalion, USMCR, will pick up toys at Shell Oil Stations, paint, repair, and ready the toys for distribution.

"Toys for Tots" was started by Marine Corps Reserve Units on the west coast in 1948. Major De Meter explained. Since that time, he said, the idea has been spread throughout the country; now, millions of toys are distributed each year to children who might otherwise fail to receive Christmas gifts. This year "Toys for Tots" is celebrating its 14th anniversary throughout the country.



Reporting from Washington

STANDING COMMITTEES OF THE HOUSE. Congressional sine die adjournment gives us all quite a chance to do other than the normal thing. So while I am about these "other things" wouldn't it be a good idea if I sent you short briefs about the Committees that have the really heavy work of legislation? Here you are:

ARMED SERVICES COMMITTEE. This Committee consists of 35 members—21 Democrats and 14 Republicans—was established by the 1946 Congressional Reorganization Act to take charge of activities affecting the Nation's defense efforts. The Chairman is the Honorable Carl Vinson of Georgia. The Armed Services Committee has jurisdiction over matters affecting: the Department of Defense generally, the Army, the Navy and the Air Force; ammunition depots, forts, arsenals, military reservations and establishments; the pay, promotion, retirement and other benefits and privileges of members of the armed forces; scientific research and development in support of the armed services; selective service; the size and composition of the Army, the Navy and the Air Force; soldiers' and sailors' homes and strategic and critical materials necessary for national defense.

APPROPRIATIONS COMMITTEE. The Appropriations Committee is the largest standing Committee, consisting of 50 members—30 Democrats and 20 Republicans. The Chairman is Representative Clarence Cannon of Missouri. When this Committee was established in 1865, it had charge of all Federal appropriations. Gradually, its jurisdiction was split among other Committees until 1922, when all appropriation measures again were placed under its authority.

The Appropriations Committee handles the hundreds of agency requests through a series of subcommittees, which report to the full Committee after hearings and examination of agency budgets. It appropriates funds for the support of the Government, conducts studies and examinations of the organization and operation of the executive departments and agencies.

Over 65 and Still Working? Social Security Benefits for You?

Many persons past 65 are still under the impression that earnings of more than \$1200 a year stops them from drawing any social security benefits. The Social Security Office reports that recent changes in the law now make it possible to pay social security benefits to some individuals past 65 who have not retired from work.

Single persons in the over 65 age group whose earnings are less than \$3000 a year or married persons over 65 who will earn less than \$3,600 in 1961 are especially reminded by Mr. Boehringer to visit the office at 10613 Euclid Ave. to file an application for benefits.

Some of these older workers may receive part of their benefits even though their 1961 earnings may be as high as \$4497. For example, a married man with two children under 18 would qualify for some benefits with average earnings of \$350 a month or \$4200 a year.

To accommodate those individuals who are working during the day, the East Side Social Security Office will be open from 5:30 to 8:30 p.m. on the next three Mondays, November 27, December 4 and December 11.

Wanted: Unknown Diabetes

Constant hunger, increased thirst, and frequent urination are symptoms of diabetes. If you don't have these symptoms, why should you test yourself for diabetes? Dr. J. Glen Smith, Cleveland's Commissioner of Health, answers this question by saying that everyone should be tested yearly for diabetes, just as he should have a yearly physical examination. If diabetes is detected early, before symptoms appear, it will be easier to control. Diabetes, sometimes called "sugar," can develop in people of any age or physical condition. It is estimated that 19,000 Greater Clevelanders have diabetes, and don't know it.

A simple test for diabetes can be made in five minutes in your own home. During Diabetes Detection Week, November 12-18, free kits containing "do-it-yourself" screening tests, were being distributed by the Diabetes Association of Greater Cleveland, in cooperation with the Cleveland Division of Health. You can obtain a kit containing four tests at a Cleveland Health Center, at your neighborhood drug store, at the Diabetes Association office, or through your company's industrial detection program.

In diabetes, the body is not able to use all of the sugars and starches which are eaten. The excess sugar passes into the blood, and through

the kidneys into the urine. Diabetes can usually control their disease by proper diet and medication under a physician's supervision. With proper management, a diabetic can lead a long and useful life. Uncontrolled, diabetes can cause blindness, heart and kidney disease, and

hardening of the arteries. Diabetes is the sixth leading cause of death in Cleveland. The best weapon against it is early detection. Take advantage of the free self-test kits offered during Diabetes Week, and throughout the year. Be tested and be sure.
