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Svinjarija brez primere

Tekom tekočega tedna smo v našem listu že ponovno omenili ime George T. Rennerja, profesorja zemljepisja na učiteljskem kolegiju Columbia univerze. Kakor smo že naših prejšnjih člankih omenili, je pri tem učenem go-podu "strokovnjaku" največja značilnost ta, da hoče na-graditi fašiste za njihove brezprimerne zločine baš z zemlji onih narodov, ki se bore na življenje in smrt za svobodo in demokracijo svoje zemlje.

Zablodam nevarnega fantasta Rennerja so že pričeli vehementno ugovarjati razni znani ameriški pisci, čas-nikarji in misleci, enega najboljših odgovorov pa smo bra-nili v "News from Belgium" v članku pod naslovom: "An American 'Geo-politician' Reshapes the World."

Med drugim je v tem članku rečeno:

Predsednik Roosevelt in Mr. Churchill sta izjavila zavezniškemu narodu, malim in velikim, da se bore za svobodo in vzpostavitev, toda Mr. Renner pa meni, da se "slabotnih ne more obdržati v vrsti ter da tvorijo prestopno vado agresivnosti," kar pomeni, prevedeno v preprostem in razumljivem jeziku, da bi moral izročiti zlatar-je ure roparjem, ker ni dovolj policistov na straži: res originalna revertera klasične solucije vsiljenja zakona.

Informacije, na katere bazira profesor svoje uteme-litve, so prav tako ničeve kakor njegove postavke. Na primer: "Češka in poljska zamejna vlada že delujeta na razpadu za Čeho-Poljsko državo," dočim je v resnici med zavezniškimi vladami sklenjen samo preliminarne spora-ke za carinsko unijo.

"Nemčija," pravi geopolitik s Columbijе, "bi morala vključevati v svojih mejah vse nemško govoreče narode Evrope." To smo že nekje slišali, boste rekli, in nobenega doma ni, da se bo Goebbels radoval te izjave. Nato na-ljuje črni magij Renner: "Alamazam, slamazum, ala-mazom!" in glej: Švica se razleti na kose! Švica je bila nad osem stoletij neodvisna demokracija, ampak to ni de: razdeli se jo med Francijo, Italijo in—kako?—Nemčijo. Prav tako gre na kose Belgija: en kos Franciji, drugi kos Angliji, tretji pa—ne pozabiti!—pri-pade dragemu, dragemu Adolfu! Zakaj? Ali ne razume-te tega? Vi ubogi, omejeni bebeci!

Z Afriko pa je, po mnenju tega učenega profesor-ja, stvar čisto drugačna. Tamkaj ste soočeni "z realnostjo" neodvisnih afriških narodov." Glede afriških narodov ni odkril profesor nobenega razloga, da bi jih raz-delili. Portugalsko poklanja Španiji, ker je premajhna, ampak Liberija pa ostane kakršna je, ker je "tradicional-na varovanka Zedinjenih držav." Tradicija je torej ko-rišna zamorecem v Liberiji, nič pa ne šteje v veke starih in visoko civiliziranih državah kakor na primer v Belgiji, Holandiji, ali Švici! ...

Toda vse te fantazije se lahko potisne na stran kot svinjarije čudaškega, svetu odtujenega norca. Saj je koncem konca tudi Faust, ko je iskal izgovor za svojo družitev z Mefistom, rekel kletlici Gretchen: "Es muss auch zolche Kaitze geben!" (Po slovensko bi se reklo: tudi taki kalini morajo biti,—ali: Potrebni so bedaki vseh vrst, ako hočemo narediti svet!). Ampak ako Mr. Renner govori tako o usodi belgijskega Konga (in mi bi lahko rekli: o usodi naše Dalmacije; uredništvo), tedaj je pri tem vse neha. Mr. Renner, ki je šest mesecev po na-padu na Pearl Harbor tako zelo zasposlen s skrbjo, da se "osigura Japonsko" in ki zna povedati toliko slabih stvari Britskemu imperiju, izroča portugalsko Angolo, del Juž-afrike, del Ekvatorialne Afrike in ves belgijski Kon-ga ... Nemčiji! Belgijske zamorce, lojalne svojim za-ščitnikom, ki so jih osvobodili izpod nemškega koloni-jalnega barbarstva, ki so se borili od leta 1914 do 1918 in ki so osvobodili južno Etiopijo iz italijanske oblasti, da-je teni gospod profesor velikodušno Nemčiji, katere prednja kolonialna politika je bila vedno izvajana po gesta-ovskih metodah ...

Zanost mora biti krasna stvar in geografija na Co-lumbia univerzi mora biti silno osvežujoča, toda naš dra-gi profesor pozablja, da se zavezniški narodi borijo v tej vojni zop, da izvojujejo zmago sebi, ne Adolfu, Benitu in Hiroku! In tu je tista njegova mala pogreška. On je na napačni strani plotu.

AMERIŠKE IZGUBE SO BILE V PRIMERU Z JAPONSKIMI PORAZI NEZNATNE

WASHINGTON, 12. junija.

Mornariški departament na-znanja, da so se Japonci izkrea-li v malem obsegu na osamlje-nem in oddaljenem Attu otoku, spadajočem k skupini Aleuti-janskih otokov, v namenu, da si zagotovijo oporišče na zapadni polobli.

Napad ni bil nepričakovan
Ladje, ki so izkrcale Japonce, so napadli ameriški armadni in mornariški bombniki in sedaj se vrši vrsta manjših spopadov. Ameriške oblasti so pričakovale slično japonsko potezo ter so bile nanjo pripravljene. Otoku Attu se ne pripisuje nobene vo-jaske ali strateške važnosti. Na otoku je mala radio-postaja, ki jo oskrbujejo oblasti Alaske.

Izguba štirih nosilk letal
WASHINGTON, 12. junija — Po poročilih mornariškega de-partmenta je zdaj ugotovljeno, da so izgubili Japonci v pomor-ski in zračni bitki pri Midway o-toku štiri matične ladje, nosil-ke letal, njihove človeške izgube pa so znašale 10.000 mož.

Bitka v Koralnem morju
V veliki pomorski bitki dne 4. 8. maja v Koralnem morju, s katero je bila odstranjena nepo-sredna nevarnost invazije Av-stralije, pa je izgubila ameriška mornarica samo matično ladjo Lexington, rušilca Simsa in tan-kerja Neosho.
Proti tem izgubam pa so iz-gubili Japonci v tej bitki naj-manj 15 ladij med njimi eno no-silko letal in štiri križarke, tež-ko poškodovanih pa je bilo pri-bližno dvajset nadaljnjih ladij.

— Sovjetske armade v Ukraji-ni, obodrene po ameriških in an-gleških obljubah glede ustano-vitve druge fronte, so danes z divjaškim pogumom protinapa-dle nemške, po tankih podprte čete na harkovski fronti.

50 tankov uničenih

Na drugi plamteči fronti, to je pred Sevastopolom, se Rusi srdito borijo proti nacijskim na-padom ter so uničili 50 nemških tankov in poškodovali kak tucat nadaljnjih.

Ruska artilerija je razbila včeraj 10 nemških artilerijskih baterij ter uničila tri nemške pešpolke in en skadron konjeni-ce.

Na harkovski fronti so uniči-le včeraj sovjetske armade 60 nemških tankov.

Radio naznanja Nemcem usod-no vest

Moskovski radio naznanja v raznih jezikih vest o rusko-an-gleško-ameriškem sporazumu, zlasti pa oddaja ruski radio to vest v nemščini preko sovraž-nih črt v nemške postojanke. Poleg tega pa pripravlja rusko vrhovno poveljstvo tozadevne letake, ki jih bodo raztrosili rus-ki letalci nad nemškimi črtami.

Tozadevna kam-panja, ki bo trajala dva tedna, se bo pričela prihodnji ponedel-jek.

Predsednik je pozival ljud-stvo, naj da ves nerabljen kav-čuk, ki ga ima, kakor na pri-mer: stare "tajerje" in tube, stare dežne plašče, stare galoše, poškodovane vrtno eevi, itd. Ves ta kavčuk naj ljudje izroče na najbližjih gasolinjskih postajah, kjer bodo dobili zanj gotovo od-škodnino v denarju.

Naš skromni profesor najbrže vsega tega ne ve. On ne ve o strašni borbi podjarmljenih ljudstev, ki umirajo, da bi njihovi svojci in potomci zopet svobodno živeli. Ti ljudje niso sicer nobeni znanstveniki, toda imajo sree na pravem mestu. A Central European Federation

(Continuation)

This virulent nationalism, even assuming that the present was indeed to be its climax, cannot be expected to vanish suddenly, and the world will have to reckon with it for many decades to come.

Like any other violent imperialism, it is not likely to bow to measures or decisions unsupported by force. Its impetus will have to be checked by an equivalent force. The philosophy of force, the tradition of force, the idolatry of force can be paralyzed at the source, but only when its exponents are made to realize that another force is able and ready to resist. In the defense of the future peace of Central Europe, as the neighbor of Germany, must provide a large part of that counter-force.

The plan of checking Germany by creating a strong Central European bulwark is not new: for a century it was the hope of many political leaders of old Austria — Slavs and Rumanians and even some German Austrians. The necessity for a strong Central Europe which could oppose Germany was what led the Czech historian Palacky to declare that Austria, if it did not exist, would have to be invented. However, the Hapsburgs failed utterly to make of Austria a barrier to Berlin's plans for *Mitteleuropa*. It is true that from 1906 to 1914 the Hapsburg Crown Prince, Franz Ferdinand d'Este, hoped as heir apparent to achieve this aim by new domestic and foreign policies. In the earliest years of my political

career as a deputy in the old Hungarian Parliament I was among those who were urging a federalist plan to replace dualist Austria-Hungary, and it was along similar lines that the Crown Prince hoped to strengthen the empire. Those plans failed; the reformers had to leave to the First World War the historic task of liberating the small nations of Central Europe. One of the greatest things accomplished at Versailles was this liberation. But one of the greatest errors committed at Versailles was the failure to strengthen the freedom and security of the new nations by providing for the organic cooperation of all their economic and military forces. Will the United States repeat this error after the Second World War?

"By way of introduction, I am the captain of a small British vessel operating in the Central Pacific Ocean writing on behalf of all of us here embarked. The nature of our business and our identity had better remain unknown. The purpose of this letter is to acknowledge the recent appeals of your announcer on behalf of the International Red Cross Society in a tangible form.

"In the remote parts of the world where we are operating there is no local Red Cross to which we could hand our small contribution. We have therefore decided to send the money to the mainland to be forwarded with this letter to you, and we request that the remittance be handed or sent to the nearest branch of the American Red Cross Society. No acknowledgment is desired."

Woonsocket, R. I. — A member of the Woonsocket Red Cross chapter was stopped recently by a 77-year-old woman who told him her plan to help the Red Cross. Wanting to join, she found it impossible to spare a whole dollar at a time from her meager budget. She was heartened by the knowledge that three cents would cover the cost of feeding a Chinese refugee for one day. "I'm saving three cents a day out of my food money until I get a dollar," she said. The dollar she later gave the chapter represented a real personal sacrifice.

FREEDOM IS INDIVISIBLE

Prof. Boris Furlan spoke on behalf of Minister Sava Kosanovic at the rally of the United Jewish Appeal, held June 3 at Hotel Astor. Other speakers were Ralph Ingersoll, Editor of P. M. and Vincent Sheean. Prof. Furlan, who represented Yugoslavia, delivered the following speech.

On behalf of Mr. Sava Kosanovich, Yugoslav Minister of State, who had to attend an inter-allied meeting in Pittsburgh, I am honored to extend to you his best wishes for the success of your meeting and the cause for which you are striving.

Your cause is the common cause of all peoples who are fighting the Nazi-Fascist tyranny. Your Jewish appeal manifests the deep rooted evil in the structure of our society. For not having answered the desperate appeals from peoples in distress, humanity is paying a heavy toll today. Had the evil been uprooted when there was still time, there wouldn't be today a Jewish appeal, neither would there be any other appeal from the now subjugated nations. All these appeals are but symptoms of the same disease which affects our inter-human relations. It doesn't matter what we call this disease: economic exploitation; persecution on behalf of race, creed, or language. All these forms of oppression show that one part of society does not recognize the dignity of the human being in the other part, which is used as a mere tool. And such is the fate of events—that every oppression, be it ever so small and insignificant at the beginning, will grow and embrace greater and greater circles. At the end, it will swallow those who thought that they could build their happiness in freedom, based on the slavery and disgrace of others. No isolation is possible in inter-human relations, no freedom for some and slavery for others. All have to be free or freedom will disappear altogether. Freedom cannot be partial or limited.

That is the way the Yugoslavs feel. This deeper understanding of the indivisibility of freedom and of the dignity of the human being came to them from the tragic experiences of their history. For the observer of historical events, it is a strange experience to see how, through vast spaces of time, the common people of Yugoslavia are following the path shown to mankind by the first pioneers of humanity, the Prophets. God stood for the unity of all mankind. The Prophets were good patriots, the best patriots of Israel, still they loved humanity above all and even above their own people. For this love of humanity they stood up against the potentates of this world, against crowned heads and princes, against temporal and spiritual lords. For the love of humanity these heroes of political courage went to jail and into exile.

In all their history, the Yugoslavs have suffered persecution and oppression, but their faith in the fundamental good nature of man never faded. This faith is the only foundation of democracy. Without it the shadow of tyranny appears, and the Nazi-Fascist theory becomes inevitable: human beings, evil by nature, need stern rulers. Education becomes futile under the assumption that men never do well, except under compulsion. Democracy becomes an illusion, if people are unable to rule themselves.

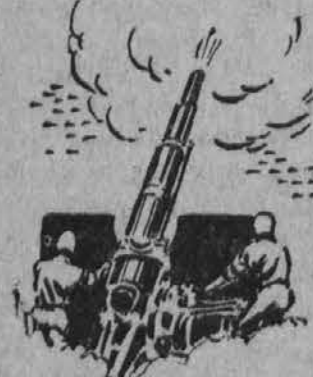

They fight and die for the rights of every man all over the world. By their heroic struggle, they are answering your appeal and they fight for the cause of the United Nations as well. Let us hope that the trees planted in the two parks in Palestine, in memory of King Peter I and King Alexander, will grow strong and beautiful, symbolizing our nations living in peace and freedom, collaborating for the benefit of all mankind.

In Red Cross Competition
