ZENEVA, Šv. - Kubanska kriza lansko jesen je pokazala, kako bi utegnila nastati atomsko vojna proti volji prizadetih držav zaradi slabih zvez med njihovimi vodniki.

Razgovori so po dolgih pogajanjih in posvetovanjih tehničnih strokovnjakov privedli do sporazuma o vzpostavitvi nove zveze. Sovjetija je njegov podpis zadrževala, med tem ko so ga bile Združene države pripravljene takoj podpisati in spraviti v veljavo.

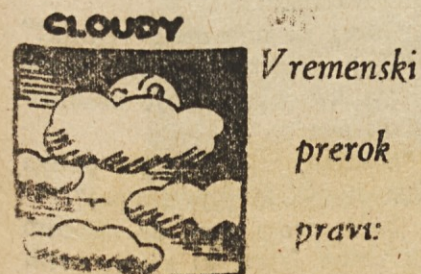

MIAMI, Fla. - Kubanski begunci so nekam v zadregi in malodušni, od kar so prišli v upor z vlado Združenih držav, ki jo je njihov vodnik Cardona obdolžil, da jih je pustila na cedilu.

Nekaj upanja nudijo sedaj vodnikom kubanskim beguncem begunci iz Haitija. Hočejo se z njimi dogovoriti za podporo upor proti Duvalierjevi diktaturi na Haitiju, nato pa se bodo s skupnimi silami lotili organizacije upora proti Castru.

Proračun Ohia za dve leti 1.3 bilijona

COLUMBUS, O. - Državni senat je v sredo izglasoval državni proračun za prihodnji dve leti v višini 1.3 bilijona dolarjev s 30:1. Proti proračunu je glasoval edino Charles J. Carney, demokrat iz Mahoning okruga.

Demokrati so trdili, da bi imela država okoli 127 milijonov več dohodka, kot jih je njena administracija v proračunu predvidela. Predlagali so zato tudi dodatne podpore šolstvu, socialnemu skrbstvu in bolnišnicam.

Nov satelit opazuje vreme

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. - Tiroso 7 se je v sredo pridružil Tiroso 6 pri nadziranju vremena visoko nad zemskim ozračjem. Podatki obeh vremenskih satelitov so posebno važni za nastanek hurikanov, tajfunov in drugih viharskih sistemov.

Tiroso 7 je bil poslan na pot okoli Zemlje v sredo z Atlas-Delta raketo. Tehta 297 funtov in obkroži Zemljo vsakih 97 minut. Od Zemlje je oddaljen od 388 do 405 milj.

Zakonski načrti imajo v glavnem sledeče cilje: jamčijo naj črncem, da bodo lahko neovirano volili. Pri tem poslu naj jim pomaga federalna administracija in Kongres ji mora dati potrebno pravico.

Odprava ruščine in uvedba angleščine na Kitajskem je slična odpravi ruščine in uvajanju angleščine v jugoslovanskih šolah po sporu z Moskvo leta 1948.

CAPTOWN, Juž. Af. - Pred nekaj tedni je prišel na trg posebni razpršilec solzivnega plina, ki ga je mogoče nositi seboj v žepu.

Razpršilec je izdelal neki nemški vseljencec, ki je delal med drugo svetovno vojno v plinskem oddelku nemške armade.

Program obsega torej kar štiri področja.

Boj zakonskim načrtom so napovedali konservativni kongresni demokratje, posebno senatorji, že sedaj žugajo z obstrukcijo v senatu, ki bi zavrle vse zakonodajno delo na Kapitolu.

Zakonski načrti gredo sedaj pred pravnega odbora senata in predstavniškega doma. Senatnemu odboru načeluje hud nasprotnik civilnih pravic senator Eastland, ki je znan po svojih podvigih pri sabotiranju dela v odboru.

Međ med seveda na Kapitolu nabirajo imena tistih 67 senatorjev, ki naj bi glasovali za konec obstrukcije. Do sedaj so našli samo kakih 55 imen, kar ni dobro znamenje za predlagano zakonodajo.

Danes dopoldne so v konklavu zbrani kardinali izvolili milanskega nadškofa Battista Montinija za novega papeža. Nadel si je ime Pavel VI. Novi papež je znan po svojem naprednem mišljenju in vztrajnem delu na socialnem polju.

Vatikani. - Danes malo pred poldne (okoli sedmih zjutraj po clevelandskem času) se je pokazal iz malega dimnika nad sikstinsko kapelo beli dim, znamenje, da so v konklavu zbrani kardinali izvolili novega papeža.

Kardinala Giovannija Battista Montinija so navajali kot glavnega kandidata takozvane liberalne skupine med kardinali, pa pri tem opozarjali, da običajno ni nikdar izvoljen oni, ki ga označujejo kot glavnega kandidata.

Novi papež je znan kot široko razgledan človek, ki razume sodoben svet in njegove potrebe. Velja za spretnega diplomata, bistrega poznavalca ljudi, življenja, pa tudi svetovnega položaja tako na verskem kot vseh ostalih področjih.

Konklave se je sestel v sredo, 19. junija. V njem je bilo 80 kardinalov, vsi z izjemo madžarskega primasa Mindszentyja, ki uživa politično zatočišče v ameriškem poslaništvu v Budimpešti, in kardinala Carlosa Maria de la Torre, nadškofa v Quito, glavnem mestu južnoameriškega Ekvadorja, ki je ostal doma zaradi starosti.

Na Kapitolu je nastal radi načrtov zelo živahen politični vrvež. Kongresniki, senatorji, politiki, časnikiarji, vse ugiba, kakšna bo usoda predlaganih zakonov.

Odnosi med ruskimi in kitajskimi komunisti so delno tudi zabavni

MOSKVA, ZSSR. — Kitajski komunisti so hoteli svojim ruskim tovarišem napraviti presenečenje. Ker je Hruščev sklical sejo glavnega odbora ruske komunistične stranke za pretekli ponedeljek, so v Peipingu objavili ravno prejšnj soto zjutraj dolgo pismo glavnega odbora kitajske komunistične stranke glavnemu odboru ruske komunistične stranke. Pogovarjala naj bi se torej odbora. Kitajci so v 55.000 besedah povedali, kaj mislijo o komunizmu in vrnili v pismo tudi 25 točk, ki naj jih obravnavata kitajska in ruska delegacija, ko se bosta sestali 5. julija v Moskvi.

Kitajski tovariši so očitno zasledovali cilj, da preko glave tovariša Hruščeva pišejo odboru. Pa so naredili račun brez krčmarja. Hruščev je prepovedal, da bi se kitajsko pismo objavilo na Ruskem.

Ceravno torej "nihče" ne ve, kaj pišejo iz Peipinga, je vendarle prvi glavni govornik na moskovski seji L. Iljičev obravnaval kitajsko stališče in ga seveda odbil. Govoril je pa tako, kot da bi bilo kitajsko pismo že znano vsem prisotnim komunistom. Morda je bilo vključeno v preložitve Hruščeva.

Pismo pa ni bilo namenjeno samo vodilnim ruskim komunistom, njegova vsebina je taka, da naj bi zanimala tudi vodstva vseh komunističnih strank po svetu. Ta ga bodo lahko brala, kajti Hruščev lahko zaenkrat prepoveduje samo na Ruskem, ne pa na tujem. Pri vsem tem je značilno, da so ruski komunisti začeli na seji najprej obravnavati "ideološka" vprašanja. Poročilo Hruščeva bo prišlo pozneje na vrsto.

Centralna afriška federacija se bo kmalu razšla

LONDON, Ang. — Anglija je imela v srednji Afriki tri kolonije: Njaso, Severno in Južno Rodezijo, ki jih je združila v posebno Centralno afriško federacijo v tistem upanju, da bodo kolonije ostale v federaciji tudi potem, ko postanejo neodvisne od Londona. Novorojene

države niso hotele slišati o federaciji, zato je londonska vlada odnehala in sedaj sklicala posebno konferenco, ki naj najde pot, kako se bodo vse tri kolonije razšle na miren način. Upajo, da bodo ta cilj lahko v kratkem dosegli.

Za Anglijo s tem sitnosti s srednjo Afriko še ni konec. Tam sta namreč neodvisni samo Njasa in Severna Rodezija, dočim je Južna Rodezija vsaj deloma še pod angleško kolonialno administracijo. Zastopniki bele rase v Južni Rodeziji imajo sedaj vso politično oblast v svojih rokah, akoravno jih je komaj 6%. Radi bi obdržali oblast tudi v neodvisni Rodeziji in ustvarili lahko nekaj takega, kot je Južna Afrika. Tega se bojijo v Kanadi, Avstraliji in Novi Zelandiji in pritisakajo na londonsko vlado, naj domačinom v Južni Rodeziji najprej zagaranti politično svobodo in vpliv na upravo in šele potem deklarira neodvisnost. Zastopniki bele rase se naravno temu protivijo in angleška vlada je še zmeraj med dvema ognjema.

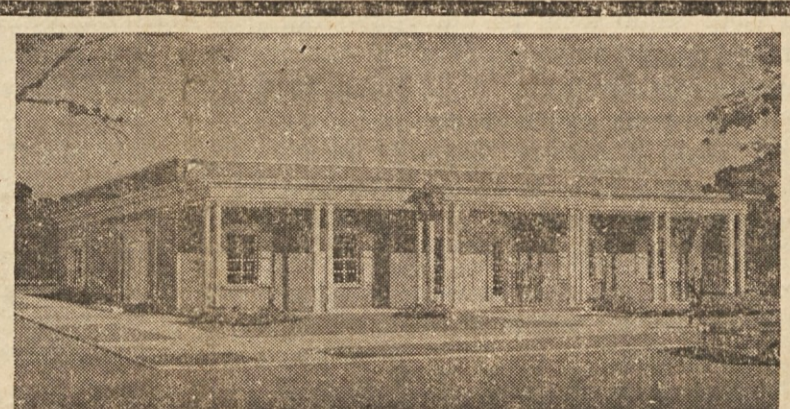

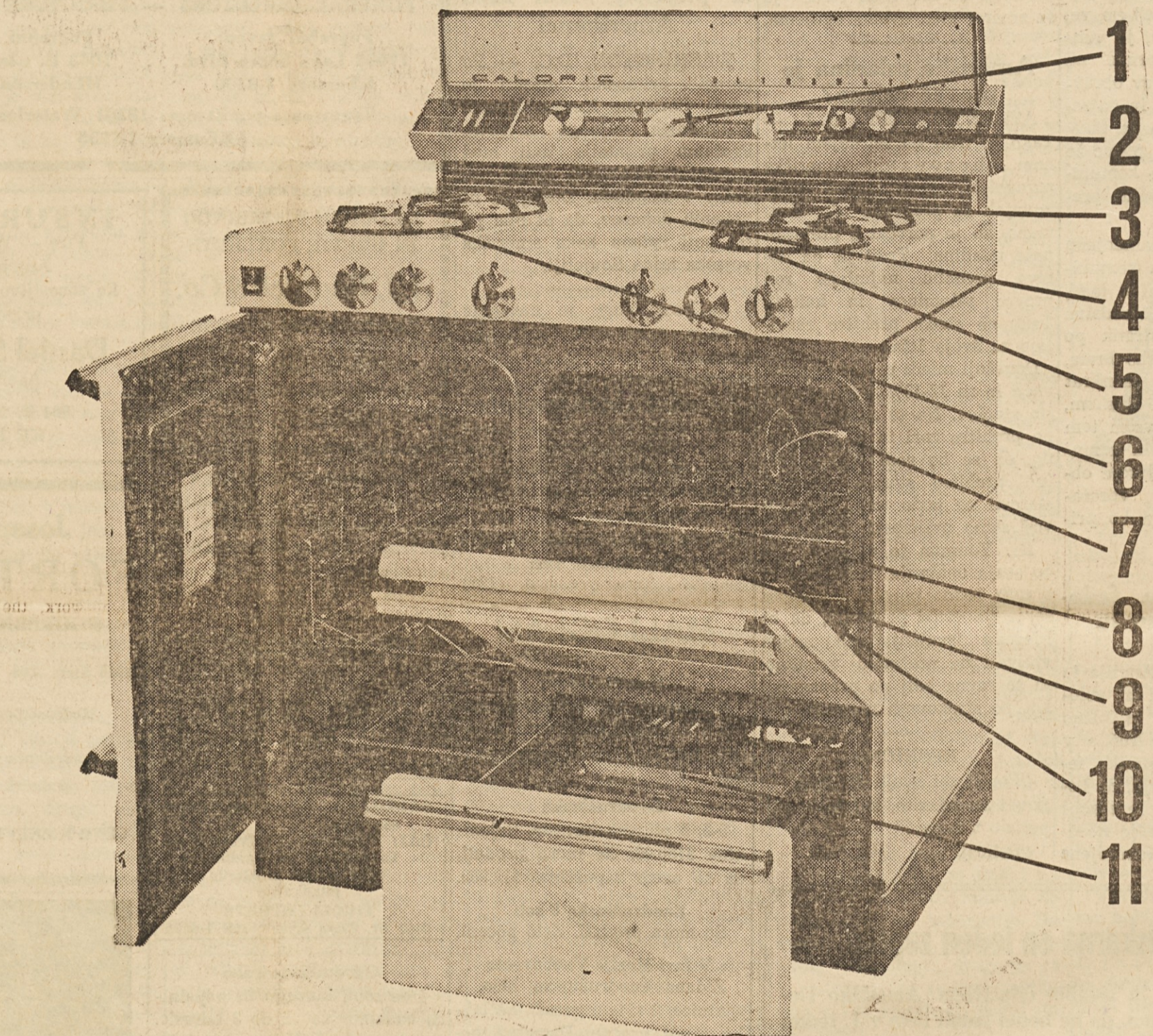

THE AMERICAN SYSTEM

A variety of phrases can be used to describe this country's economic system. It is called a free economy — meaning that producers and consumers have freedom of choice in deciding what to make and what to buy. It is called a private enterprise economy — meaning that private individuals and organizations, working voluntarily, supply the spark that keeps the nation going.

There's still another term that covers important ground. Our's is a profit and loss economy. And both of these elements can play a more important role in determining what will happen to employment, investment and growth than is generally recognized.

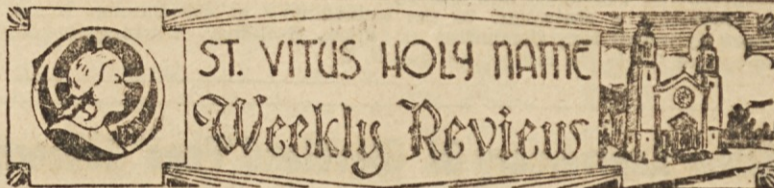
The taxes on profit, to begin with, go a long way toward supporting government — all the way from multi-billion dollar missile programs down to municipal functions. Then, a much smaller proportion of these profits goes to investors in the form of dividends or interest — and this attraction is what keeps investment funds flowing. Finally much of the profit is plowed into the enterprise, for new machinery, new buildings, new developments of a thousand and one kinds — and the results are more and better jobs, new products and higher living standards.

The function of losses is more subtle. A steadily losing business, generally, is a business offering something or other which consumers don't want. Investors shy away from it. Then, ultimately, the end comes because the wants of the people change. When the market for buggy whips disappeared people stopped putting money into buggy whip factories. They put it elsewhere, where it produces desired goods and services.

What has this system produced? To sum up in a few words: More good things for more people than any other system ever devised.

SS. Cyril and Methodius Celebration

Cleveland, Ohio. — Last call for the great SS. Cyril and Methodius 1100th anniversary celebration. It will be held on Sunday, July 7. In the morning at St. Vitus Church a Solemn Mass in the old Slavonic tongue will be offered by Msgr. Tomislav Firis of the Greek Catholic St. Nicholas Church. This will be the 10:00 o'clock Mass to which all Slovenians are invited. Many people in national costume will be present. Singing will be by the St. Nicholas Croatian Greek Catholic Church choir. We will remember the great saints Cyril and Methodius in our prayers and also public celebration.

The afternoon program will be held at St. Joseph's KSKJ park on White Road. Singing by many Slovenian Choral groups and several talks paying homage to the 1100th anniversary of the coming of the saints to Slovenia will be on the program, followed by a social. M. K.

'Safe Thinking'
Have you ever watched a weight lifter pick up a bar bell? He bends his knees and crouches before attempting to grip the bar. Then he grasps the bar firmly, centering the load for better balance. He then lifts by pushing up with his leg muscles and comes to an erect position.

There must be a good reason why all weight lifters follow this same procedure. They try to use the strongest body muscles for lifting the load. These are the leg muscles. Positioning the load also equalizes the distribution of the load for both sides of the body.

Proper lifting is as simple as that. Yet many workers suffer back and abdominal strains simply because they either do not know how to lift or they do not bother to follow the safe procedure.

Here are four points to think about when you are ready to lift something manually:

- 1. Bend your knees and crouch
- 2. Center the load
- 3. Get a good grip
- 4. Push with your leg muscles, taking as much strain as possible off the back and abdominal muscles.

There is one main difference between the weight lifter and the worker. The weight lifter attempts to lift the heaviest load possible, while the worker is required to lift only a reasonable weight.

When the load weight appears excessive or it is large and bulky, ask for help.

If you follow the above four points you will not only be preventing injury to yourself but you will be setting a good example for other workers. Show your fellow workers that you can not only talk safety but also that you can think and act safely as well.

Cleveland Area Slovaks To Observe 11th Centenary of SS. Cyril & Meth.

At Our Lady of Levocha Shrine in Bedford, Ohio (Cleveland, O.) — Slovaks in the Cleveland area will commemorate the 1100th anniversary of the conversion of the Slovak nation by the 9th century brother saints, Cyril and Methodius, who came to ancient Slovakia from Constantinople in 863. Although the Slovaks, who constituted the core of the Kingdom of Moravia in central Europe, had known about Christianity for a century or more before the coming of the brother apostles, it was not until their arrival that they responded as a united people to embrace the Christian faith. The influence of SS. Cyril & Methodius after they had come at the invitation of the Slovak ruler, Rastislav, who requested emperor Michael III to send him missionaries that knew the language of his people, spread throughout lands occupied by Slavic nations. Today directly or indirectly all Slavic countries, including Russia, Ukraine, Slovenia, Croatia, Serbia, Bulgaria, Bohemia, Moravia, Poland and Slovakia, trace their faith to these remarkable teachers of the work of God. Their success was due to their native genius, their holiness of life and their preaching in the vernacular of the people.

On July 4th at high noon, the Rev. Abbot Theodore Kojis, O.S.B. will offer up a solemn pontifical mass in Latin sung in the ancient Slovak language that SS. Cyril and Methodius employed in translating the sacred scriptures from the Greek, Hebrew and Latin into the vernacular. Father Michael Lacko, S.J., an expert on the Eastern church liturgy in Rome, will assist at the jubilee mass and will explain the historical significance of the event at an afternoon ceremony. The Rt. Rev. Monsignor Milos Mlynarovich, national president of the Slovak Catholic Federation of America, will deliver the sermon at the mass. Monsignor Francis Dubosh, P. A., former president of the Federation and the Slovak League, will close the day's ceremonies with benediction at the shrine. Mr. Joseph Duris, director of Music and organist at St. Benedict's Church, will lead the choir of fifty male voices for the mass. The especially trained choir will sing hymns that are over a thousand years old.

All over the free world wherever the Slovaks live, this year is a great centennial year. They are celebrating this great historic event with greater fervor than ever before because in their native homeland where the Slovaks have cherished the Christian faith as their greatest national heritage since the ninth century, their spiritual Faith is now endangered by a ruthless, atheistic communist regime that has vowed to destroy this legacy of the ages. Accordingly, the Slovaks who enjoy freedom in the West are determined to call attention to the whole world that their fellow countrymen are suffering persecution for their faith at the hands of their alien oppressors. In commemorating the centenary, therefore, they are not satisfied merely to celebrate but to use the occasion to arouse free men everywhere to resist godless forces that have declared war on religion and enslaved millions of human beings... among them five million Slovaks in central Europe.

The late Pope John XXIII issued a special encyclical known as "Magnificus events", in which he traces the history of the brother apostles who brought the light of faith to the Slovaks in Great Moravia, and to other Slavic peoples beyond the Danube. The Vatican State has issued a special commemorative stamp, and the Slovaks of America, Canada and the free world have joined hearts and minds, and have donated generously to their Slovak Mission Institute that bears the name of the brother apostles in Rome. The new religious center will be dedicated on Sept. 15 this year.

In this message to the 42nd national convention of the Slovak Catholic Federation last month, president Kennedy paid tribute to the organization as "a prime factor in preserving among Americans of Slovak extraction the very attributes of faith, humility, and love of God and Country, which were impressed on the ancient Slovaks by SS. Cyril and Methodius."

All in all, the 1963 centennial will go down in history as the greatest centenary celebration honoring SS. Cyril and Methodius on the 1100th anniversary of their coming to the land of the Slovaks whom the apostles to the Slavic nations converted to the Christian faith, which all generations of Slovaks since have cherished as their greatest spiritual heritage.

Hints of Sign Stealing Flare in Chi Twin Loss: The suspicion of sign stealing from the Wrigley Field scoreboard flared anew, June 5, while the Giants were being swept out of a double-header by the Cubs. With an unusual show of power, the Cubbies smashed 13 hits off Jack Fisher and Gaylord Perry to win the opener, 9-5, and amassed 12 hits off Jack Sanford and one off Bobby Bolin to capture the encore, 5-4.

Several times during the barrage, Giant Manager Alvin Dark went to the mound, consulted with his pitcher and catcher, and changed the set of signs being employed. After one trip, Dark asked Umpire Ken Burkhardt to order open windows in the scoreboard closed.

Chicago Vice-President John Holland, informed of this, telephoned the board himself and told the men operating it to "stand back out of sight from the windows and remove all doubt."

Dodgers Likely to Operate With Six Farms Next Year: In discussing the new first-year player rule and its effect on baseball, Vice-President Buzie Bavasi of the Dodgers cited some alarming figures that show the steady contraction of the club's one time farflung farm system. "For the past 15 years, the Dodgers either owned or had working agreements with an average of 12 clubs," said Bavasi "In 1963, we reduced our farm system from nine to seven clubs, and next year we'll probably operate only six. REORGANIZATION ACT EXTENDED.

Last week the House passed H.R. 3496, to extend the Reorganization Act for two years. Chances are that the real significance of this action escaped the public's attention. Originally approved in 1949 under recommendation of the first Hoover Commission, it was the purpose of the law to enable the President to promote efficiency and economy by giving him the authority to rearrange, consolidate, or abolish agencies and offices. He was not to establish any new Department or take on any function not expressly authorized by law. Either House of Congress could veto the Presidential proposal by passage of a resolution within 60 days after the plan was submitted. Through the years there has been general agreement in both parties with this purpose and arrangement. However, during 1961 and 1962 President Kennedy submitted "reorganization plans" which went far beyond the intent and purpose of Congress. He submitted a plan to establish a new Cabinet post (Urban Affairs) not authorized by law. This was decisively voted down last year 264 to 150. In addition he proposed plans which would give the President more control over the quasi-judicial regulatory bodies (SEC, FCC, NLRB) and that more authority over all citizens be concentrated in these groups. The Congress vetoed four of the nine plans submitted in 1961 and 1962.

In order to make it clear that new government departments are not to be created under authority of the Reorganization Act an amendment to this effect was adopted by a vote of 227 to 174. I supported this amendment and the extension of the Act which was then approved by voice vote.

LAST CALL FOR ACADEMY EXAMS

In my Newsletter of May 18th there was an item about the 1964 appointments to the Service Academies—Annapolis, West Point and the Air Force. I again wish to remind all young men who are interested that the Civil Service competitive examination will be held in Cleveland on Monday, July 8th. Many have written requesting permission to take the exam, but there is still room for more.

Applicants should be actual residents of Ohio's 22nd District, and they must have reached their 17th but not their 22nd birthday by July 1, 1964. This is a wonderful opportunity for young men not only to serve their country, but also to receive an excellent education. I urge all who are interested to write me immediately at 450 Cannon House Office Building, Washington 25, D. C.

CLEVELAND HARBOR HEARINGS

This week I joined my Cleveland Congressional Colleagues and others in presenting a statement to the House Appropriations Committee in support of funds for continuing the

improvement of Cleveland Harbor. Funds are included in the Budget for the bridge replacement program and for maintenance dredging. In addition, we are requesting the sum of \$27,000 for the preparation of plans for deepening the East Basin to 27 feet. This was authorized in the last Congress and unless the money is appropriated at this time the project will be delayed by a year. The Port of Cleveland is now at a competitive disadvantage in that it cannot accommodate vessels in the general cargo trade requiring depth clearance in excess of 23 feet.

I reminded the Committee that the Cleveland Harbor Program has been a real partnership project in that the City of Cleveland, the railroads and the industries have all invested considerable sums as well as the Federal Government. The projects for which we are seeking funds have all been approved by the Corps of Engineers and authorized by Congress. In their reports the Engineers have consistently noted the high benefit to cost ratio of the Cleveland Harbor improvements.

Silver Anniversary Of Cleveland 'Pops' Concerts

Conductor Louis Lane and The Cleveland Summer Orchestra—whose musical horizons encompass a kaleidoscopic array of tastes ranging from Broadway melodies to classical concertos, from Filmland scores to folk-tunes—enter upon the silver anniversary season of "Pops" Concerts this month. Mr. Lane and his 79 musicians open the gala 25th season with Viennese Night, Saturday, June 29, at 8:30 in the Public Auditorium.

Since 1939, when 12 concerts were presented, entertainment history has been written at the Cleveland Pops. Nearly 1,500,000 Ohioans and tourists have enjoyed this warm-weather series, making it one of the foremost in the country. The outstanding pageant of stars has included such diverse performers as Frank Sinatra, Duke Ellington, Van Cliburn, Leroy Anderson, Ethel Smith, John Sebastian, Andre Kostelanetz, Erroll Garner, Victor Borge, Eartha Kitt, Mischa Elman, Herb Shriner, Jose Melis, Maria Tallchief, Roger Williams, Anna Russell, Lanny Ross, Dave Brubeck, Vivian Della Chiesa, Frankie Laine, Arthur Fiedler, Rudolf Friml, the Modern Jazz Quartet, Ferdo Grofe, the Sauter-Finegan Orchestra, Andre Eglevsky and G. Shearing.

This summer is no exception. Among the procession of notable personalities starting in the 25th "Pops" season are Peter Nero, Henry Mancini, the Weavers and the Lola Montes Spanish Dancers. Entering his 12th year as "Pops" maestro, Mr. Lane has fashioned a diverting array of 15 events, twice a week through Aug. 17.

Vronsky and Babin, praised as "the most brilliant two-piano team of our generation", star in the season-opener, Viennese Night, June 29. A portion of the proceeds will be used for the benefit of the Cleveland Institute of Music, of which Mr. Babin is the director.

Several other highly esteemed Cleveland performers will be spotlighted during the quarter-century "Pops" celebration. Pianist Eunice Podis and Violinist Ernest Kardos are featured on closing night, Aug. 17, a "Popsourri" of all-time favorites. Theodore Lettvin, "a spell-binding pianist", appears on Tchikovsky Night, July 10.

Because the appeal of America's great tunesmiths has been demonstrated in recent seasons, seven programs will be devoted to selections from the musical theater. Two different Rodgers and Hammerstein Nights are scheduled. Assistant Conductor Michael Charry will direct the first on July 6. A completely different "R & H" program is slated for Aug. 14. Selections from the smash hit, "Camelot", will be a feature of Lerner and Loewe Night, July 13. Broadway Night, July 17, includes beguiling selections from three of the Rialto's recent box-office bonanzas: "West Side Story", "Music Man" and "The Most Happy Fella". A concert version of "Show Boat" is a highlight of Kern and Hammerstein Night, with Mr. Charry conducting, July 27. On tenth annual Cole Porter Night, Aug. 3,

the Public Auditorium will resound with saucy selections from "Kiss Me Kate", "Anything Goes" and other longrun musicals. The sassy, sweet and sorrowful melodies of George Gershwin are the offering on Aug. 7, with the internationally-known pianist, George Haddad, making his "Pops" debut as soloist.

Timeless favorites from the beloved light operas of Herbert and Romberg will enchant listeners on Aug. 10.

An innovation this season is "An American Salute", with Mr. Charry on the podium, July 3. This Fourth-of-July Eve program includes music that has stirred the hearts of Americans from the Revolutionary War to the present, with the sensational folk-singers, the Weavers.

"Popsgoers" will spend "An Evening With Henry Mancini" on Aug. 1. Winner of two consecutive Academy Awards, the gifted composer-conductor of films and television returns to his hometown with "Moon River", "The Days of Wine and Roses" and other hits.

Clevelanders will have their first opportunity to "hail the conquering Nero" this summer. Peter Nero—who has become a top-demand star in little more than a year—ignites his hot piano with his trio, July 20.

Castanets will click and heels will stomp when the world-famed Lola Montes Spanish Dancers make their initial "Pops" appearance in a Fiesta Program, July 25.

The "Pops" Choral returns once again this season to lend a masterly lilt to eight programs. The cavalcade of song also brings back many exceptional vocalists who are familiar to "Pops" audiences. Among the outstanding returnees are Louise Carlyle, Patricia Marand, Anita Darian, Bonnie Murray, Jack Russell, William Tabbert, James Hurst, Norman Atkins, Ronald Rogers and Richard Miller. Gifted newcomers include Rosalind Hupp, Peggy Denny, Jeanne Grant and Robert Simpson.

The Cleveland "Pops" has evolved from the Great Lakes Exposition of 1936-37. During the big fair on Lake Erie's shore, the Great Lakes Symphony Orchestra, made up of Cleveland Orchestra musicians, performed in a bandshell on the Mall.

When the exposition closed, Edgar A. Hahn, a prominent local attorney and long-time chairman of The Musical Arts Association's Summer Concerts Committee, conceived the idea of using the idle Aquacade on the lakefront. In 1938, at the rechristened Aquastage, 35 members of The Cleveland Orchestra performed in a series of light operas backed by the Snuberts of New York. The Snuberts withdrew their support at the end of the season.

In 1939, The Musical Arts Association, parent organization of The Cleveland Orchestra, launched the "Pops" Concerts at the Public Auditorium. The series has been presented there every year except one. In 1953, while air-conditioning was be-

ing installed at the Auditorium, L. Lane and his team moved to the ballyard to hit musical "home runs" for the Cleveland Indians. The following year, they took time out from the "Pops" Concert series to make one appearance at the plate batting 1000 in an All-Star Game.

The Cleveland "Pops" of today, in the tradition of the outdoor garden concerts of olden days, are informal and sociable affairs. Colorful tables and chairs, in the continental manner, bedeck the main floor of the Public Auditorium. The aircooled arena wears a holiday dress of soft, multi-hued lights and floral bouquets. "Popsgoers" relax with a smoke, a beverage, a snack, while music forms the cohesive material for complete gemuetlichkeit.

Rudolph Ringwall conducted most of the summer musicales for 13 years. Louis Lane has been in charge of the festivities since 1952.

Tickets for tables on the main floor and seats in the balcony will be placed on sale Monday, June 17. These reserved seats are available at the Severance Hall ticket office, 11001 Euclid Ave., Monday through Saturday from 9 a. m. to 5 p. m.; at Burrows, 419 Euclid; and through all Burrows stores.

Secretary's Open Letter To High School Students

Washington, D. C. — "As school closes for the summer vacation many of you will be considering a decision which will affect your future life: Should you or should you not go back to school next fall?

This is literally the \$50,000 question—for this is the average difference, our surveys, between the lifetime incomes of those who finish high school, and those who don't. Your decision to go back and finish up may very possibly be the difference between your life meaning something instead of being spent fighting the fear—and the fact—of unemployment.

Today belongs to the educated and the trained. Tomorrow the demand for skills will be even greater.

It used to be that a young person could drop out of high school when he turned 16 and get an unskilled job, where, with luck and hard work he could progress to better jobs and make a decent living for himself and a family.

This isn't true today. Even the beginning jobs now go to high school graduates, and many employers are demanding even higher education. The machines are doing away with unskilled work and with the job opportunities once available to school dropouts.

The large bulk of today's unemployed do not have a high school education. Unemployment among school dropouts is half again as high as among high school graduates and three times as high as among workers with some college training.

These facts cry out to young people today: don't sell yourself and your country short by failing to get all the education you can.

If you have money problems at home that threaten your education, talk with your school counselor. There are many ways today to help finance your education.

Certainly, this summer seek interesting and remunerative work, but don't be misled by the lure of a pay check or the independence you gain from a job. That feeling of freedom and responsibility which your summer job may give you now can fast turn into a yoke of frustration and hopelessness if you try to complete in the labor force without the necessary education and training.

So do yourself a favor—plan to go back to school next fall and complete your education. It will pay off in the long run, in personal satisfaction and in cold hard cash.

Cleveland, Ohio. — Those Cleveland Indians' ticket stubs which fans used to throw away on a clear evening or after the fifth inning on a threatening weather day will be worth gifts ranging from pen and pencil sets to autographed baseballs and baseball caps at the Stadium.

Each ticket stub, whether it be a box seat stub, a Ladies Day or Golden Age Day tax stub or a bleacher stub, is worth a specific number of points. A box seat stub, for example, is valued at 27 points and a bleacher seat stub is worth seven points.

The prizes also are valued at a specific number of points. An autographed ball, for instance, can be obtained for 900 points—and when a holder of stubs decides to exchange the valuable ticket stubs he merely goes to the Tabulation Center at Gate A, Section 19, in the tribune concourse during any of the Tribe's home games and selects his gift or gifts.

The Indians advise the holders of the premium stubs to follow the simple procedure of sorting the stubs according to each type of seat the ticket stub represents. Bundle each stack and tie with string or rubber band and mark the number of tickets in each stack.

From there the fan has only to check in at the Tabulation Center, fill out a simple form indicating which gifts he would like to have and this completes the procedure.

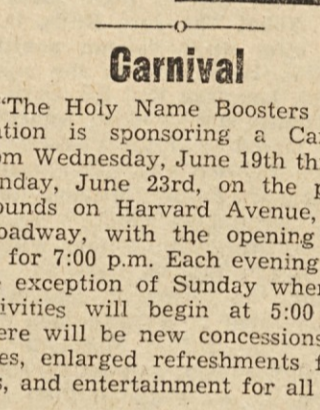

BAD NEWS FOR LAWN WEEDS Not too many years ago, weeds were almost as much a part of our lawns as the grass itself. We cursed them and pulled them out by hand—or we let them grow, depending on how we felt. If they got too bad, we probably dug up the whole business and started over, with fingers crossed that our next attempt would be more successful. There were weed killers, to be sure, but they killed everything, including the grass.



In the 1940's the discovery of 2, 4-D, a plant-growth regulator, created quite a stir in agriculture and horticulture. This material effectively controlled many broad-leaved weed plants and yet was relatively harmless to fine-leaved plants, including the lawn grasses, in control. Several different materials have been developed which are even more effective than 2, 4-D against some kinds of broad-leaved weeds. One of these is 2, 4, 5-TP, which has been assigned the coded name silvex.

At first available only in liquid form, and applied as sprays, the broad-leaf weed killers posed many problems for the average householder. Several of these materials were highly volatile. The slightest breeze could cause the spray fumes to drift, resulting in serious injury to broad-leaf ornamentals and crops nearby. Also, it was necessary to keep two sprayers: one for routine pest control and the other for the weed killers, because it was impossible to remove all weeds from a lawn. The different materials for each type vary somewhat in effectiveness, depending on conditions of temperature, soil moisture, etc., but all come in dry-granule formulations and are easy to apply with a lawn spreader. Prevention is the basic part of lawn management. Proper choice of lawn grasses, plenty of fertilizer and water at critical periods, and somewhat less frequent and less drastic mowing, combine to encourage the growth of turf and to inhibit weeds. The fact is, it is difficult for weeds and crabgrass to compete with a well-established healthy turf. FIRST AID FOR SMALL FRY

Warm weather and outdoor fun often mean a bumper crop of bruises, cuts and other hurts for the "skate and scooter" set. To help mothers be ready with up-to-date first aid, the makers of Children's Bufferin offer these tips:

STOP NOSEBLEEDS: have child gently blow his nose to remove clots and blood that might clog the throat or hinder breathing. Then, moisten a small wedge of sterile cotton with nose drops and insert in the bleeding nostril. Apply pressure to outside of nose for 5 minutes.

A BURN is sterile: You need only cleanse the surrounding area. Don't use butter or ointment, you could infect it. If necessary, protect the burn with a thin plastic that won't stick to the skin.

MINOR SCRATCHES or cuts don't need antiseptics—a gentle sudsy washing will do as well.

A FIRST AID KIT should be kept handy. In addition to bandages and tape in different sizes, it should always include an analgesic such as Children's Bufferin, to ease the pain or discomfort of spring colds, and a thermometer.

"Hunting In Ohio" Booklet Now Available

Columbus. — The publication of a new booklet, "Hunting In Ohio", has been announced by the Information and Education Section of the Department of Natural Resources. The 64-page publication deals with the seeking and taking of all game and fur species in Ohio. It tells where and how to hunt every wildlife species of importance to outdoorsmen, and includes special tricks and techniques of the authors or the experts whom they consulted. Some of Ohio's top hunters were contacted to gather the facts. A chapter on the field care of game is also included.

N. Z. Kills Deer To Save Takaha

Wellington, N. Z. Three government hunters killed 1,600 deer in rugged Fiordland national park recently because a rising deer population there threatened to consume all the snowgrass essential for the survival of the wingless takahe. One of the world's rarest birds, the takahe was rediscovered in the park in 1948. The hunters reported sighting 30 of them.

Well illustrated with photographs and sketches, this how-to booklet also contains maps showing the general distribution of the major game species as an aid to hunters in planning their excursions. Many of the articles in the booklet appeared first in the Ohio Conservation Bulletin. It was edited by Merrill C. Gilfillan, publications writer and former game biologist with the Ohio Division of Wildlife for 20 years.
