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OB TEDNU...

Necenzurirana poročila iz Nemčije naznanjajo, da so nacisti izdelali velikopotezne načrte za kongres nacistične stranke v Nuerembergu, ki se je imel vršiti preteklega septembra letošnjega leta. Ta kongres je imel biti "Kongres zmage," in voditelji in reprezentantje poraženih narodov so imeli marširati v mimohodu pred tribuno, na kateri bi bil stal — Hitler. Višek slavnosti pa je imela tvoriti neka "visoka osebnost angleškega kabineta," ki je imela predstavljati poraženo Anglijo. Ker ni Hitler do zadnjega trenutka izpremenil teh načrtov, se sodi, da se je nemško vrhovno poveljstvo najbrže res zibalo v nadah, da bo nemška armada do meseca septembra z uspešno invazijo zavojevala Anglijo. — Toda, človek obrača. Bog ja obrne, oziroma je v tem slučaju obrnila angleška trdovratna vztrajnost in angleška zračna sila.

Eden izmed vzrokov neuspeha italijanskih vojnih sil vzhodni Afriki je, pomanjkanje vojnih potrebščin v tem delu sveta. Ko je Italija vstopila v vojno, je mornarica Velike Britanije ujela in zasegla v Rdečem morju dvoje italijanskih ladij z vojnimi potrebščinami, ki sta bili skoraj zadnji ladiji, natrpani z vojnimi materialom za Italijane. Italija ne more spraviti danes skoro nobenih potrebščin več v vzhodno Afriko, ker so angleške bojne ladje in angleški bombniki na neprestani preži. Nekaj častnikov in pilotov kakor tudi nekaj zalog najpotrebnejših rezervnih delov za letala, so sicer spravili Italijani z letali preko Sudana in preko razdalje 1,600 milj v vzhodno Afriko, in nekaj vojnih potrebščin so vtihotapili tja na arabskih čolnih in ladjicah, toda vse to pomeni kapljico v morje. Vse te metode so se izkazale za vse premalo izdatne, in to zlasti glede dobave gasolina, zato ne morejo Italijani pričeti nikake važnejše akcije v Afriki, kjer tiče kakor v hermetično zaprti steklenici.

Vsa poročila svetovnih listov, prihajajoča iz Beograda ali iz drugih bližnjih krajev na Balkanu, slikajo dr. Korošca, predsednika jugoslovanskega senata, kot simpatičarja Italije in osiščarja in kot nasprotnika demokratičnih držav. V enaki luči so prikazovala ta poročila bivšega predsednika jugoslovanske vlade dr. Stojadinovića, o katerem se je pozneje izkazalo, da je bila sodba teh listov pravilna.

Slovenski listi nimajo v Evropi svojih poročevalcev, zato so odvisni za svoja poročila od velikih svetovnih listov, ki poročajo o položaju, kakršen je. Ti listi oziroma njihovi poročevalci nimajo nobenega povoda, zavijati resnico, če pišejo na primer o položaju Madžarske, Rumunije, Bolgarije, itd., ter o državnih teh držav, zato se smatra njihova poročila za verodostojna, toda čim sporoče o dr. Korošcu to ali ono neljubo vest, je takoj ogenj v strehi pri naši klerikalni gospodi. "Židje pravijo tako!... Židje lažejo tako!..." Nam na primer ne dovoljujejo podčrtati tega, kar smatramo mi kot Slovenci za važno, sami pa si dovoljujejo izpuščati iz svojih poročil, posnetih po istih virih, cele odstavke, v katerih je rečeno, da je neki slovenski verski in politični voditelj znan po svojih simpatijah do rimsko-berlinskega osiščarja.

Churchillovo poročilo o vojnem položaju

Angleški premijer Winston Churchill je te dni pred parlamentom podal poročilo o vojnem položaju, v katerem priznava, da stoji Anglija še vedno pred hudimi dnevi, da pa je polna upanja in vere v končno zmago.

Poročal je, da je bilo v doslednih zračnih napadih na London in druge angleške pokrajine ubitih 14,000 civilistov, dočim je bilo 20,000 ranjenih. Najhuje je trpel in še vedno trpi London, na katerega odpadejo štiri petine vseh žrtev. Ta vojna pa je manj nevarna za vojake kot civiliste, kajti v vseh nemških napadih je padlo samo 300 vojakov in 500 je bilo ranjenih.

Churchill je dalje rekel, da je Nemčija izgubila deset aviatikov za vsakega angleškega letalca.

Izjalovljenje Hitlerjevega načrta za invazijo Anglije je zgodovinsko pomembna zmaga za Veliko Britanijo, je dejal ministriški predsednik, ampak narod ne sme pozabiti, da nevarnost invazije še vedno obstoji.

Churchill je dalje naznanil, da ima danes Anglija trdna letalska oporišča na Grškem, s katerih bo nadaljevala z razbijanjem italijanskih mest in središč, ter da je pripravljena nadaljevati z borbo do 1944, ako bi bilo treba.

Ob istem času, ko je Churchill podajal poročilo poslanski zbornici, je zunanji minister Halifax v zbornici lordov naznanil, da je Jugoslavija odklonila zahteve, katere je stavila nanjo Nemčija. Obenem je apeliral na francoski režim v Vichyju, da naj se izogne izdajstvu Velike Britanije.

IZ STARE DOMOVINE

Problem prehrane

Uprave dravske banovine je izdala določbe glede kontrole nakupnih cen na drobno. Zaslужek prodajalca se ravna po vrsti živil in sme znašati od 10 do 20 odstotkov. Iz besedila določb je razvidno, da so se cene raznih življenjskih potrebščin dvignile za več kot 40 odstotkov v enem letu. Prodaja belega kruha je prepovedana in istotako se ne sme prodajati isti dan pečeni kruh.

Za prehrano mest

Vlada v Beogradu je izdala uredbi, da se mora v vsaki mestni občini ustanoviti poseben odbor za preskrbo prebivalstva z najvažnejšimi živilimi. Te ustanove bodo dobile v obliki posojil

potrebna denarna sredstva iz kreditov, ki so bili določeni za direkcijo za prehrano. Pomanjkanju krompirja v Ljubljani je odpomogla mestna uprava s tem, da je nakupila večje množine krompirja, ki ga prodaja prebivalstvu v lastni režiji.

Znamenje časa

Po odlokih naučnega ministrstva se bo v bodoče v klasičnih gimnazijah poučeval nemški jezik namesto francoskega. Izprememba se izvede postopno. Na realnih gimnazijah v Ljubljani se bo namesto francosčine poučevala italijanščina.

Mohorjeva družba

Nedavno je državno namestništvo za Koroško razpustilo Mohorjevo družbo v Celovcu. Mohorjeva družba, ki je bilo prvo slovensko knjižno društvo, je letos v juliju obhajala svojo osemdesetletnico. V teku svojega 80-letnega delovanja je razpečala med Slovence nad 81 milijonov knjig. Leta 1917 je dosegla svoj višek, ko je imela 90,000 članov. Po letu 1919 se je razdelila na jugoslovansko in koroško-slovensko vejo; prva je imela svoj novi sedež v Celju, sedež druge pa je ostal v Celovcu. To koroško vejo je zdaj posušil strupeni nemški dih iz Berlina.

Novo naselje

Predsednik ministrskega sveta je odredil, da se novo sezidanemu naselju na območju Srednje vasi v Bohinju, radovljiški srez, da kot novo naseljenemu kraju ime Goreljek.

Nenavadna nesreča

Nedavno popoldne je bila odšla 12letna Ljudmila Ulipijeva, hčerka posestnika in župana Ulipija na Frankolovem pri Vojniku, na frankolsko pokopališče, da bi tam očistila grob svoje stare matere. Ko je bila deklica pri delu sklonjena nad grobom, se je nenadoma podrl 200 kilogramov težki nagrobni spomenik in se zrušil na deklico. Ljudje so kmalu nesrečo opazili in potegnili nezvestno deklico izpod spomenika, toda revica je dobila take težke poškodbe, da je na prevozu v bolnišnico izdihnila.

V Sarajevo je nedavno dospel za delom sezonski delavec Halil Ahmet s svojima dvema hčerkama, šestletno Razijo in štiriletno Samido. Razija in Samida nista nikoli jedli ničesar razen posojenega črnega kruha in se ne moreta privaditi na nikako drugo hrano. Karkoli sicer vzameta vase, izbruhata. Njune oči pa so take, da sta čez dan skoro popolnoma slepi, v temi pa imata tako oster vid da najdeta šivanko na tleh. Zdravniki so mnenja, da sta otroka bolna za neko boleznijo, ki nastane vsled pomanjkanja vitamina A.

Dvoglavi otrok

V Grljanu blizu Zaječara je 20letna kmetica Ljubica Florideva v bolnišnici rodila otroka z dvema glavama, ki pa je živel le 24 ur. Do poroda je prišlo tri mesece prezgodaj.

V Otočcu v Liki je bil nedavno izpuščen iz zaporov, kjer je predsedal dve leti zaradi raznih vlomov, neki Stojan Vukmirović. PRUSHECK MEMORIAL EXHIBIT OPENS AT S. N. HOME TODAY

Today at 2 p.m. the Prusheck memorial exposition will be opened in the lower hall of Slovene National Home, 6417 St. Clair Ave. The exhibition will remain open till next Sunday, November 17. Nearly 150 paintings of the artist who died on June 7 of this year will be shown.

It is expected that lovers of art will take advantage of the opportunity and purchase many of the exhibited paintings. Favorable response is also anticipated from our local lodges and clubs, in order to make the exposition a success, morally and financially. Several lodges have already taken the matter up at their meetings and voted to buy pictures from the memorial exhibition.

H. Gregory Prusheck was born March 11, 1887 in Sodražica, Yugoslavia, and came to America as a boy. He wandered all over the United States and early became conscious of his mission. The urge to create manifested itself in him spontaneously. Although he never had any academic training, his paintings, when shown at the independent artists' exhibition in Chicago, immediately aroused the interest of discerning art critics.

Samuel Putnam, distinguished art critic of The Chicago Evening Post, in an article entitled "Melting Pot and Palette," wrote at that time:

"For the past ten years, or thereabouts, the impression has been forced upon me, more and more, that the greatest hope we in America may look for in the arts lies in the general direction of what we commonly (and sometimes, a bit too self-consciously — not to say patronizingly) refer to as 'melting pot population.' This is true in literature, and it is true in music... It is particularly true, I believe, in those arts known as graphic and plastic — in painting and in sculpture. I merely ask you to look about at the painters and the sculptors who are doing the best, the most significant work in America today. In most cases, they will be found to be immigrants or the sons and daughters of immigrants..."

"Modern art is a return to the primitive. Its essential notes are simplification and directness — above all, simplification. These are, essentially, the peasant notes. They are the qualities you find in the work of H. Gregory Prusheck."

"In Mr. Prusheck's paintings you will find, in addition to essential simplification and directness, a number of highly individual qualities. Chief of these, as I see it, is a certain dynamic rhythm of line. Some lines sing — look at the back of some of his feminine torsos. Others swoop and sweep, with the sense of mastery and power. Such is Prusheck's. He has dynamism..."

"Mr. Prusheck possesses that rare combination of power and delicacy. You will discern the latter in his watercolors. But

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always that same line. And it is that same line, coming — from somewhere; I cannot say how far back — out of a European peasant's hut, which may end, a hundred years or so from now, by transforming the face of this America of ours. I hope so, at any rate — even against hope!"

The exhibition is under the auspices of the Slovene National Home and its cultural committee.
